Dear Mr. Schneider:

The City of New London welcomes the opportunity of having a communications tower installed within Bates Woods Park.

The tower will be utilized to increase the public safety communications capacity between the local enforcement agencies and will also provide a positive change in the wireless coverage footprint for all wireless carriers utilizing the tower.

The communications tower is being installed at the present location of an existing ball field light pole and fixture. The existing light fixture will be re-attached to the new tower for continued illumination of the ball field.

The proposed location will not directly impact any of the surrounding neighborhoods as it pertains to aesthetics or safety.

The City is also in reviewing the needs of the adjacent high school and a decision will be made at some time in the near future to either renovate the existing building or replace it with a totally new structure. When that occurs, the present wireless carriers presently located on the building roof will need to be relocated. The best location would be on the newly installed cell tower within Bates Woods Park.

The cell tower will also provide continuous revenue to the City of New London which can be used to maintain the park area should the City deem it necessary.

It is the intention of the City to not go out for any requests for proposals or construction bidding for the project. The City is requesting that AT&T design, install and monitor the construction of the cell tower and all of its equipment.

Installation of the tower will not begin until such time that the City has reviewed the final plans for the project, received copies of all regulatory permits giving AT&T permission to construct the tower and negotiated in good faith with the City a binding lease agreement.


Dear Mayor Finizio:

We are writing to you on behalf of our clients Message Center Management, Inc. ("MCM") and New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC ("AT&T") with respect to the above captioned matter involving a proposed wireless telecommunications tower facility to be located at Bates Woods Park in the City of New London. The purpose of this letter is to formally notify you and the adjacent community of Waterford of the proposed facility and commence a municipal consultation process prior to any formal application being filed by MCM and AT&T with the State Siting Council. Enclosed you will find a detailed Technical Report for the City-owned Bates Woods Park location which includes information on the need for the proposed facility and the environmental effects of the project as identified at this time.

Project History and Prior City Review

In 2011, AT&T conducted a search for a new site to provide needed wireless service to businesses, residents and other uses in the area of Interstate 95, State Highway 639, Jefferson Avenue and Route 1 in the City of New London. As part of its search, an AT&T representative identified an existing T-Mobile rooftop facility located on the existing New London High School building at 490 Jefferson Avenue. In approaching the City, City officials indicated that this building may be demolished entirely and not available for co-location in the future. Thereafter, AT&T and City officials together evaluated the replacement of an existing light pole serving an athletic field at Bates Woods Park adjacent to New London High School as a possible option for AT&T and any future relocation of the T-Mobile facility.

In February of 2012, AT&T submitted a package of various technical and planning materials detailing the proposal to replace a light tower with a wireless tower facility at the Bates Woods Park parcel. Subsequently, AT&T and MCM agreed to pursue this project jointly with MCM coordinating directly with the City. AT&T and MCM have collaborated in the past in other parts





of the State given MCM's role as an infrastructure developer and AT&T's interest principally as a wireless service provider.

Starting in mid 2012, MCM worked with City Staff, consistent with its own prior work on projects in the City, and submitted to the Planning and Zoning Commission technical information detailing the proposed facility for purposes of an 8-24 review. MCM appeared before the Planning and Zoning Commission at its November 15, 2012 meeting to discuss the project. At that meeting, the Planning and Zoning Commission issued a positive recommendation regarding the project. A copy of the Planning & Zoning Commission positive recommendation is attached. Thereafter, a lease agreement with the City for the project was approved by the City Council at its January 7, 2013 meeting. For your convenience, a copy of the City Council resolution approving the lease agreement is provided.

Municipal Consultation

At this time, we are providing the enclosed Technical Report in accordance with Section 16-50*l*(e) of the Connecticut General Statutes, which requires consultation with a municipality in which a tower facility is proposed prior to submission of an application with the Connecticut Siting Council. As you may know, jurisdiction over any proposed cellular tower facility rests exclusively with the Connecticut Siting Council pursuant to Section 16-50i and x of the Connecticut General Statutes. The purpose of local consultation is to give the municipality in which a facility has been proposed and the municipality within 2,500 feet of a proposed facility an opportunity to provide the applicant with any recommendations or preferences it may have prior to the applicant's filing of an application with the Siting Council.

In reviewing Section 16-50*l*(e), you will note that municipalities have the option of conducting a public information meeting on any proposed cellular tower facility. Given that this project has been considered by the City for the past year plus and reviewed in detail at both Planning & Zoning Commission and City Council meetings, as well as by City Staff, we would simply anticipate discussing any additional details and other aspects of the Siting Council process you may have. We note further that irrespective of a municipalities election to hold public information meetings, this project will require notice to abutting property owners and numerous state and municipal agencies at the time an application is formally filed with the State Siting Council.

Notice is hereby given, pursuant to Section 16-50l(g) of the Connecticut General Statutes of a public information meeting to be held at the City of New London Council Chambers at 181 State Street New London, CT 06320 on March 20, 2013 beginning at 6:30pm. The subject of the meeting will be a forthcoming application to the Connecticut Stifus Council ("Stifus Council") by Message Center Management ("MCM") and New Cingular Wireless ("AT&T") (together the "Applicants") for a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need for the construction and maintenance of a wireless telecommunications facility at Bates Woods Park which is owned by the City of New London ("Facility").

The proposed tower facility consists of a replacement monopole tower and a 4,155 square foot compound in a portion of the parcel adjacent to a baseball playing field off of Chester Street approximately 1,150 feet from New London High School.

MCM proposes to replace an existing 90' above grade level ("AGL") light pole with a self-supporting 115' AGL monopole tower which in addition to lights can accommodate emergency/municipal communications antennas as well as those belonging to federally licensed wireless carriers. AT&T would install up to twelve (12) panel antennas at a centerline height of approximately 111' AGL and some additional equipment on the tower. An associated 12' x 20' equipment shelter would be installed at the tower base on a concrete pad within a compound together with provisions for a back-up power generator. The compound will include equipment of other carriers as well as municipal equipment and be enclosed by an eight (8) foot tall chain link fence. Vehicle access to the facility would extend from Chester Street through an existing parking lot and existing access drive for 845', then along a new gravel access drive a distance of approximately 195' to the tower compound. Utility connections would be run underground from an off-site utility pole on Chester Street.

The Facility is proposed to allow AT&T to provide service in this area of the State. At the meeting the Applicants' representatives will explain the need, purpose and benefits, location, height and other features of the proposed Facility.

We are writing to you on behalf of our clients Message Center Management, Inc. ("MCM") and New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC ("AT&T") with respect to the above captioned matter. On January 25, 2013, we forwarded to both yourself and to other various New London and Waterford officials a technical report related to a wireless telecommunications tower facility to be located on City property. As you will recall, this project was previously the subject of review by the City Planning & Zoning Commission and City Council as part of approving a lease with MCM for the project.

At your request, MCM hosted a public information meeting at City Hall this past Wednesday, May 20th as provided for in Section 16-50*l* of the Connecticut General Statutes. Over 70 property owners in and around New London High School and Bates Woods Park were notified by mail of the meeting and the meeting was publicly noticed in the Day as noted in the enclosed affidavit provided by the newspaper. A few members of the public attended the informational session at which time the project team presented the enclosed powerpoint presentation. We were able to answer all the public's questions and we are pleased to advise you that no opposition to the project was articulated given the light pole replacement location well removed from any nearby residences.

At this point in time, MCM and AT&T are preparing an application to the State of Connecticut Siting Council which we anticipate will be filed in late April or early May, copies of which will be provided to the City. 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




Light Pole Replacement with Combination Cell Tower/Light Pole Structure **Bates Woods**








AT&T Current Coverage at New London, CT





AT&T Composite Coverage (with S2838 @ 112' AGL)







