

There are approximately 40 residences within 1,000 feet of the East Street Facility. The closest off-site residence is located at 163 East Street, approximately 450 feet to the southeast. Weather permitting, the Applicant will raise balloons with a diameter of at least three (3) feet at the East Street Facility location on the day of the Council's hearing on this Application, or at a time otherwise specified by the Council.

b. Environmental Reviews and Agency Comments

Section 16-50j of the General Statutes requires the Council to consult with and to solicit comments on the Application from the Commissioners of the Departments of Energy and Environmental Protection, Public Health, Public Utility Regulatory Authority, Economic Development, and Transportation, the Council on Environmental Quality, and the Office of Policy and Management, Energy Division. In addition to the Council's solicitation of comments, Celco, as a part of the National Environmental Policy Act ("NEPA") Checklist, solicits comments on the proposed East Street Facility from the U.S. Department of the Interior, Fish and Wildlife Service ("USFWS"), Environmental and Geographic Information Center of the Connecticut Department of Energy Environmental Protection ("DEEP") and the Connecticut Historical Commission, State Historic Preservation Officer ("SHPO").

(1) USFWS Compliance Determination

According to the USFWS Compliance Determination dated December 1, 2014, no federally listed or proposed, threatened or endangered species or critical habitat are known to occur in Southington, Connecticut. The proposed development of the East Street Facility would not, therefore, have any adverse effect on federally-listed, endangered or threatened species. (*See*
