DOCKET NO. 461A GREENWICH SUBSTATION AND LINE PROJECT MONTHLY CONSTRUTION PROGRESS REPORT MAY 2019

1. COS COB SUBSTATION

Work continued on the modifications to Cos Cob Substation, including testing of electrical equipment, removal of old equipment, installation of control cabling, and maintained erosion and sedimentation controls. The new substation equipment was placed into service on April 15. Restoration is on-going and is expected to be completed by end of June 2019. Table 1 in Attachment 1 summarizes the status of the substation work as of May 31, 2019.

2. 290 RAILROAD AVENUE WAREHOUSE DEMOLITION

Asbestos abatement, as required prior to the start of demolition work, was completed for all areas except for the asbestos-containing roofing materials (which will be removed as part of the warehouse demolition). Table 2 in Attachment 1 summarizes the status of the warehouse demolition work as of May 31, 2019.

3. 115-kV DOUBLE CIRCUIT UNDERGROUND TRANSMISSION LINE

Duct bank construction on the double-circuit transmission line commenced on April 1. Through May 11, work continued in Bruce Park, along Wood Road and Bruce Park Drive; road and off-road areas affected by construction in Bruce Park were restored – construction activities in the Park will resume November 1, 2019. Other construction activities included site testing in various roads, as well as duct bank installation along Indian Field Road and the separate 1703 and 1020 Line exits from Cos Cob Substation. One vault (5201) located at Cos Cob Substation was installed.

Table 3 in Attachment 1 summarizes the status of the transmission line work as of May 31, 2019.
