Re: Town of Greenwich Petition for Reconsideration, November 29, 2017 / Docket #461A

As an intervenor in the above-referenced matter I support the Town's Petition for Reconsideration of your decision to allow Eversource Energy to build an open air substation at 290 Railroad Avenue. As you recall, the Town argued that if the project were to be approved, the better site is 281 Railroad Avenue and the preferred design is a fully enclosed, indoor station, much more in keeping with the aesthetics in the neighborhood and safer both due to the enclosure of the building and its lack of proximity to the AirGas facility which adjoins 290 Railroad Avenue and presents a potential hazard in the event of a fire or an explosion.

As the Town has made you aware, a recent joint study by the Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection and the University of Connecticut's Marine Science Division has indicated that the existing flood plain elevations will need to be higher in the near future due to rising sea levels. This new information makes the case for 281 Railroad Avenue even more compelling.

I urge the Siting Council to amend its original decision in light of this new information and change the approved location of Eversource's new substation from 290 Railroad Avenue to 281 Railroad Avenue.
