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SENATOR MURPHY: Ladies and gentlemen, I'd like to call this meeting of the Siting Council to order at 7 p.m. on November the 1st, 2016. My name is James Murphy. I'm the vice chairman of the Connecticut Siting Council, and I'm chairing the meeting this evening in the absence of our Chairman Robert Stein who cannot be with us. Other members of the Council who are

Other members of the Council who are present this evening are Robert Hannon, the designee for Commissioner Robert Klee of the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection; and Larry Levesque, designee for the Acting Chairman John W. Betkoski, III., of the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority; and Daniel P. Lynch, Jr.

Members of the staff who are with us today are Melanie Bachman, our acting executive director as well as our staff attorney, and Robert Mercier, our siting analyst.

This is a continuation of a public hearing which began at 3 p.m. this afternoon. Copies of the hearing program and the Council's Citizens Guide to Siting Council Procedures are available to members of the public.

This hearing is held pursuant to Title

16 of the Connecticut General Statutes and of the

Uniform Administrative Procedures Act upon an

amended application of American Towers, LLC and

New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC for a Certificate

of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need for

the construction, maintenance, and operation of a

telecommunications facility located at 351A Boston

Post Road, East Lyme, Connecticut, or for the

construction, maintenance, and operation of a

telecommunications facility at an alternative site

located at 2 Arbor Crossing, East Lyme,

Connecticut.

On September the 29th, 2016, this

Council, pursuant to the provisions of Connecticut

Statutes 4-181a(a), reopened the final decision

which was to deny without prejudice the original

application and to reopen this docket to consider

a new alternative location for the proposed

facility.

This application is also governed by the Telecommunication Act of 1996, which is administered by the Federal Communications

Commission. This act prohibits the Council from considering the health effects of radio frequency

emissions on human health and wildlife to the extent the emissions from the tower are within the federal acceptable safe limits standard, which standard is also followed by the State Department of Public Health here in Connecticut. The federal act also prohibits the Council from discriminating between and amongst carriers for providing the same service. In essence, what it means is if one carrier is providing service to a given area, because there is service in the area, you cannot discriminate and prohibit some other carrier from attempting to provide that service in the same area.

On this revised application the applicant published notice of the filing of this amended application to the Council in The Day of New London on August 19th and August 22nd of 2016. The Council's legal notice of the date and time of this hearing was also published in The Day on October 4, 2016. Upon the Council's request, the applicant erected a sign at both proposed sites so as to inform the public of the name of the applicant, the type of facility, the hearing date, and location and contact information to the Council.

This afternoon members of the Council, staff, and the public personally conducted a field review of alternative site at 2 Arbor Crossing, East Lyme, in order to observe firsthand the potential effects of the proposal. The applicant also flew a balloon at the site at the height of the proposed facility, which is 105 feet.

This hearing session tonight has been reserved first for the public to make short statements into the record. These public statements are not subject to questions from the parties or the Council, and members of the public making these statements may not ask questions of the parties or the Council. These statements will become part of the record for Council consideration.

A sign-up sheet is available for those who would like to participate. Someone has signed up so far. And there's a sheet in the back for those who would also like to participate.

As a reminder to all, off-the-record communications with members of the Council or a member of the Council staff upon the merits of this application is prohibited by law.

I wish to note that the parties and

intervenors including the representatives and witnesses are not allowed to participate in this public comment session.

I also wish to note for those who are here and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors who are unable to join us for this public comment session this evening, that you or they may send written statements to the Council within 30 days of the date hereof, and such written statements will be given the same weight as if spoken here at the hearing this evening.

If necessary, party and intervenor cross-examination that began this afternoon at 3 will be continued on. It won't be because we finished up this afternoon with cross-examination.

We ask that each person making a public statement in this proceeding to confine his or her statements to the subject matter before the Council and to avoid unreasonable repetition so that we may hear concerns of all your neighbors. We're not going to have that many speakers tonight. Please be advised that the Council cannot answer questions from the public about the proposal.

A verbatim transcript will be made of

this hearing and deposited at the East Lyme Town
Clerk's office for the convenience of the public.

Before turning to the speakers for this public session, we had asked the applicant to make a brief presentation to explain to those that are present tonight what it is they are proposing in this second round for a proposed telecommunications facility in this general area of East Lyme. And Attorney Christopher Fisher will make a presentation on behalf of the applicant.

Chris.

MR. FISHER: Thank you, Senator Murphy.

My name is Chris Fisher. I'm from
Cuddy & Feder. I represent AT&T in this
particular matter. I see some familiar faces
here. I'm just going to give a brief background
to bring everyone up to speed, for those who
haven't necessarily followed where we've been over
the last two years.

There's an existing 150-foot tower at the top of the hill in The Orchards development.

That tower has been there for about 30 years now, providing service to the surrounding community.

AT&T, working with the property owner, understands

that that tower has to come down. And what we've been trying to work on with the Town, various stakeholders, and others is a replacement facility so that we minimize any disruption of service to our customers.

As you know, there are several thousand people who live in and around that area. Route 1 is fairly well traveled. The site has been, for lack of a better word, kind of an anchor for AT&T on which service has been provided and their surrounding network built up over the years. So our goal has been over the last couple of years to try to find a replacement facility.

Without going into too much detail, some of you may remember we were here, probably in the summer of 2015, if I recall correctly, went through a couple of different alternatives. One alternative fell out because of various objections from the Mohegan Tribe. The one alternative that was presented to the Council in an application in the fall of 2015 is at 351A Boston Post Road, which is a residential parcel of property. For those who recall, it's a 194-foot tall monopole with AT&T and space for other carriers, a typical monopole-type configuration with space upgrade for

equipment shelters in a fenced-in area.

Part of the process, we solicited feedback from the Town, others, and I think it became clear through some opposition we received to that particular site location that there was a desire to come up with some other alternatives, notwithstanding the fact that AT&T, I think, had looked at over 30 in the community.

So prior to the close of the public hearing, we advised the Council that we'd like to work on that, and we were pleased to work with the actual owners, developers, and homeowners association in The Orchards to try to come up with an alternative to present to the Council. So with the better part of the spring of 2016 and this past summer, we worked in collaboration to come up with a design proposal that would meet their objectives and our needs and present that back to the Council.

That's really what's before the Council with this latest application amendment we submitted. And as the Chairman mentioned, it's a 105-foot silo structure. I'll just walk through, really briefly, the plans that are on file and also on the Council's website.

For those of you who know the community well, I'm assuming you do, you kind of come up the hill, Plum Hill Road. And when you get to the end of the road now, you get to the entrance of an existing clubhouse, parking area on the left, tennis courts to the right, and a pool house to the rear of that. This area actually -- and these are lots that are all laid out and approved. They're not fully developed yet. This is where there is some additional and current development of housing now in the development. And part of the road is actually under construction.

AT&T would propose to build a gravel driveway that would extend along this lot, back to the rear of the pool area. This is where the existing tower is. I pointed up here to the top of the hill. This would be decommissioned and the site restored. And in this particular location, from what we would propose to build -- this is just a little bit more detail on the site plan on the grading details; this probably shows it best -- propose to build a 105-foot tall flow silo structure within which there would be space for AT&T and additional carriers. We show up to four here.

I will tell you that both T-Mobile and Verizon have expressed their interest to the Siting Council in locating at this particular site. So we would work with them, depending on the Council's direction and approvals, if granted, to accommodate their needs.

The silo, itself, would be -- if you've had a chance to look at some of the visuals -- would be not quite a white but more of a muted finish. And then the barn structure, which is a special, custom-built barn structure -- this is not typical for our industry -- but in this particular location, working with The Orchards, we've come up with a design that we think certainly complements the silo and would accommodate the equipment areas for up to four carriers as well internal to this existing structure.

So the structure, itself, and the silo, really with feedback from The Orchards and our design team, we tried to come up with something that to a certain extent harkened back to the fact that this used to be an apple orchard, some type of an agrarian type of structure, meet our needs, and come up with something we could present to the

- Siting Council. So our ultimate goal at AT&T is to try to work on a replacement structure, and this would be an alternative, and that's up to, ultimately, the Council to decide whether or not

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to approve this.

- We'll now move to the public segment of this public hearing this evening. And our first speaker is the First Selectman of the Town of East Lyme, Mark Nickerson. I again apologize for not realizing you were in the back of the room this afternoon, and we got started without you.
- MARK NICKERSON: Vice Chair Murphy, I owe you the apologies. I thought Ms. Bachman was chairing the meeting this afternoon. I must have been answering an e-mail when you introduced yourself earlier. So my apologies to you.
- And to the Commission, welcome -SENATOR MURPHY: I've been left out of
  worse things.
- 22 MARK NICKERSON: Indeed.
- 23 So Senator, thanks for holding your
  24 meeting here in our community. Multiple times
  25 you've done this. You are doing yeoman's work.

Mr. Fisher and his team certainly has as well. We welcome you to the community. I trust you found a good place to have dinner. And we thank you for that.

I need to go on record to tell you we have received zero opposition to this proposed plan. We feel that it meets everyone's needs, obviously AT&T's needs, and the Siting Council's need to further the cellular reaches in this area. But it does so with a nod toward not deteriorating the value of a neighborhood and becoming an unsightly thing. We think this is just a great thing that we were able to bring both parties together. I applaud the citizens of The Orchards realizing that this is an opportunity here. And it's a win-win-win, as I said this afternoon.

I don't want to take up a whole lot of time. I'm sure you want to go back and watch some World Series tonight, but thank you for coming. There's no opposition in this town. The Town does not oppose this plan, and we hope that you'll find it to be suitable as well

SENATOR MURPHY: Thank you very much.

On this sheet I have Ron J. Rando.

RONALD RANDO: Good evening, ladies and

gentlemen. I'm not against this project. I think it's pretty good looking, from what I looked at on the map there. But I've just got a few things to say about the site that we thought it should go on before.

You know, we have a problem in this town when we want to do something and we have one or two people that bitch about it, and then they move out of town. I think the site that was up there on Ancient Highway was a lot better than what you've got here, and I think it would have been out of the way and nobody would see it that much, but it didn't go there. But I think it's a good idea. We need it. And we have to get going with these new electronics systems we have coming into effect all over the country.

And I'm not here to complain about it.

And I think everybody will laugh because they'll say, Every time you're there, Rando, you're complaining about something. But I'm not complaining. I just don't think this is the best site for it. Thank you.

SENATOR MURPHY: Thank you.

On the second list we have -- is it Joseph Drabik?

1 JOSEPH DRABIK: Drabik. SENATOR MURPHY: I'm sorry about the 2 3 pronunciation. JOSEPH DRABIK: It's the handwriting. 4 5 I'm going to forfeit. I think it would be easier because I'd be slightly off topic. 6 SENATOR MURPHY: You want to pass. 7 8 Giancarlo D'Angelo. 9 GIANCARLO D'ANGELO: Sorry. I should have wrote that clearer. 10 11 I just want to thank the Siting Council for coming to our nice town here, like the 12 13 selectman said. My name is Giancarlo D'Angelo. You probably saw my name on a lot of forms. 14 15 the president of The Orchards. 16 The neighborhood is completely for it. AT&T has been fantastic. They came down, they 17 18 showed us a whole bunch of different renderings. We worked with them. The builder is on board; 19 we're on board. Everybody in the neighborhood is 20 totally for it. And we're very thankful that AT&T 21 22 was willing to give us this beautiful barn as 23 opposed to the tower. 24 So thanks, everybody. And I hope the

Siting Council approves this. The neighborhood is

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1 fully for it.

2 SENATOR MURPHY: Thank you very much.

3 And Len Schunemeyer.

4 LEONARD SCHUNEMEYER: Len Schunemeyer.

I'm a resident of The Orchards. I live at 23 Plum

6 Hill.

And I want to thank you for coming back and hearing this again, and AT&T as well. It's been a great thing going forward. I just wanted to -- I had heard from the earlier meetings that there were concerns that residents were unaware. As far as I know, we were notified in March, during our annual meeting, that this was going to be a topic of discussion. The people who did bother to show up, we discussed it, and there was no negative comments there, so to back up what John said.

As far as I know, through either the personal contacts that I have or The Orchard's own Facebook page, there have been no negative comments on it at all. And from everybody that I've talked to, we all embrace the idea of replacing the existing structure, which is typical of a cell phone tower, with something that is not so obtrusive in the town. Thank you.

1 SENATOR MURPHY: Thank you.

That is the last name I have on either of the lists.

Is there anyone else here who desires to be heard this evening?

(No response.)

SENATOR MURPHY: Once more, is there anyone else?

(No response.)

SENATOR MURPHY: If not, I'm going to close the public hearing, and it will be closed until we do our findings of fact and decide which way to go in this matter.

Okay. That being the case, I will proceed to close this hearing. The Connecticut Siting Council announces that briefs and proposed findings of fact may be filed with the Council by any party or intervenor no later than December the 1st, 2016. The submission of briefs or proposed findings of fact are not required by this Council, rather we leave it to the choice of the parties and intervenors.

Anyone who has not become a party or intervenor but who desires to make his or her views known to this Council may file written

statements with the Council within 30 days hereof, which is also December the 1st, 2016. The Council will issue draft findings of fact, and thereafter parties and intervenors may identify errors or inconsistencies between the Council's draft findings of fact and the record. However, no new information, no new evidence, no arguments, no reply briefs without our permission will be considered by this Council. Copies of this transcript of this hearing will be filed at the East Lyme Town Clerk's office. I hereby declare this meeting adjourned. I thank you for your participation. (Whereupon, the above proceedings adjourned at 7:24 p.m.)
