# How Hispanics can better prioritize their health

*Metro*

Hispanics are a highly influential, successful and culturally diverse group. As one of the fastest-growing sectors of the U.S. population, Hispanics can drive change, and one area many Hispanics are concerned about is healthcare.

The 2013 Health Disparities & Inequalities Report from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention highlights disparities and inequalities across a wide range of diseases, behavioral risk factors, environmental exposures, social determinants, and healthcare access by sex, race, ethnicity, income, education, disability status and

other social characteristics. Based on the data, Hispanics need to recognize that some conditions and risk factors may disproportionately affect them more than non-Hispanics. Such recognition may prove the catalyst to getting the preventative care Hispanics need to overcome certain conditions.

The CDC points out that cancer, heart disease, unintentional injuries, stroke, and diabetes are the five leading causes of death among Hispanics. However, health issues such as asthma, Chagas Disease and obesity also affect a large number of Hispanics. The CHDIR notes that, in 2010, the most recent

year for which information was available, diabetes was more prevalent among Hispanic and non-Hispanic African American adults than it was among white, non-Hispanic and Asian adults. Obesity continues to be problematic for Hispanics, particularly among females of Mexican descent. Furthermore, the CHDIR indicates a large percentage of Hispanic workers are employed in high-risk occupations, which can increase their risk of injury.

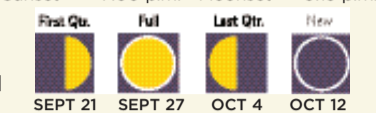

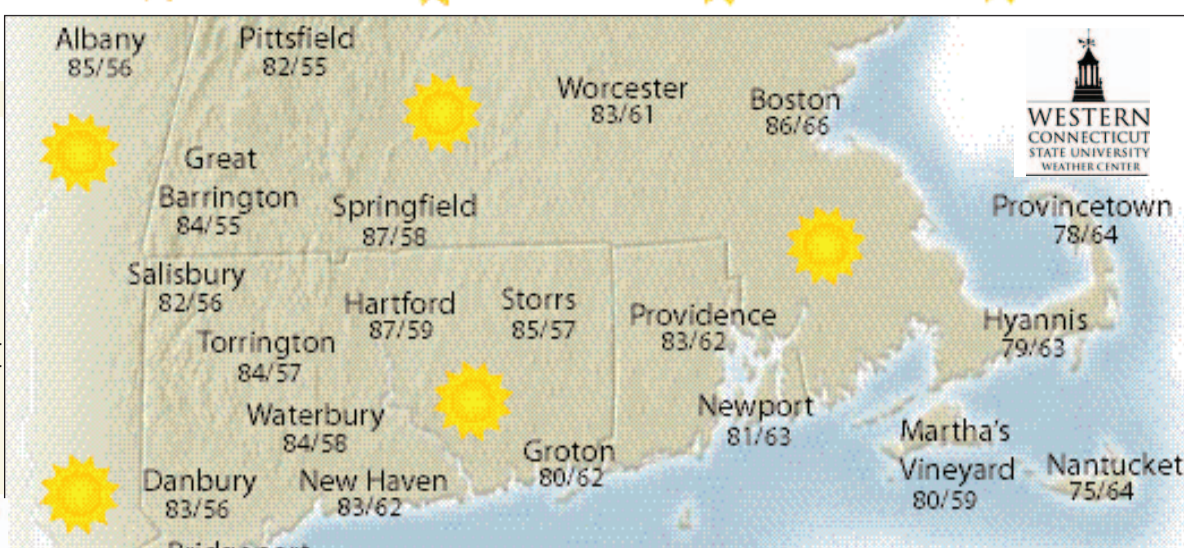

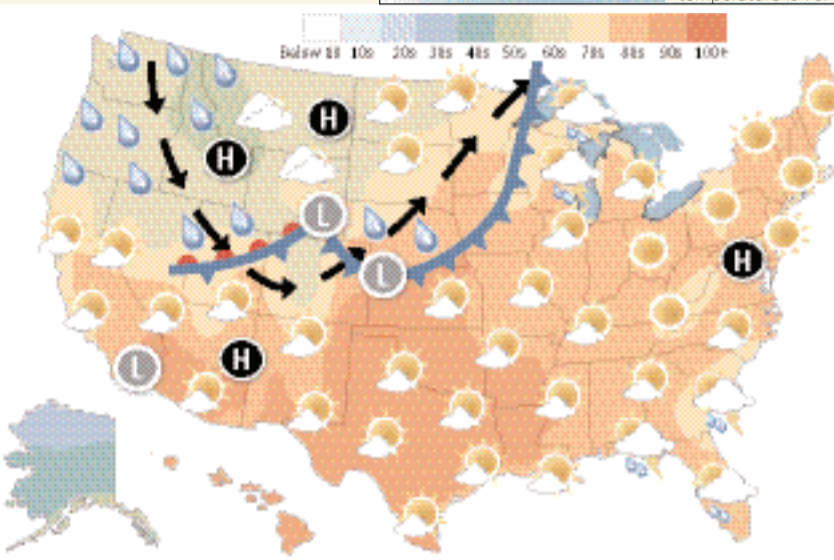
**Today in Weather History**

# 6 canyon hikers found dead, 1 still missing following flash flood

ZION NATIONAL PARK, Utah — Seven hikers who entered a narrow desert canyon for a day of canyoneering became trapped when a flash flood filled the chasm with water,

killing at least six of them in Zion National Park in southern Utah, officials said Wednesday. Known as a slot canyon, the passage is as narrow as a window in some spots and several hundred feet deep. Flooding can turn such canyons

into deadly channels of fast-moving water and debris in just minutes. A sudden deluge of rain fueled the flood, which “went from a trickle to a wall” of water, park ranger Therese Picard said. Concerns about more

flooding have prevented search-and-rescue teams from entering Keyhole Canyon to look for one hiker still missing. Rescue teams with dogs were looking several miles downstream in piles of debris and in shallow ponds of water that form in

rocks. Others were wading through waist-high water in the nearby Virgin River. Park rangers commonly warn hikers about flood risks during monsoon season and did the same with this group before the hikers entered the canyon. But there was no way

to reach them in time to alert them to the violent floodwaters coming their way. Officials say the group got a permit to hike the canyon at 7:40 a.m. Monday, before the canyons were closed because of flood warnings issued at 2:22 p.m.

# The history of National Hispanic Heritage Month

National Hispanic Heritage Month highlights the historical and cultural contributions

of Americans who trace their ancestry to Spain, Mexico, Central and South America, and the Caribbean. The event began as a week-long recogni-

tion in 1968, but transformed into a month of celebration 20 years later.

Hispanic Heritage Week began under President Lyn-

don Johnson, who recognized how Hispanic and Latino people helped shape the nation. The week of celebration began on Sept. 15, which is an important date in Hispanic history. Sept. 15 marks the anniversary of independence for Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua. Mexico, Chile, and Belize celebrate their independence at roughly the same time.

As the Hispanic population in the United States grew, it only made sense to expand celebrations regarding the legacy of Hispanic peoples who helped turn America into the land it has become. President Ronald Reagan expanded Hispanic Heritage Week into a full month of celebration in 1988. The Public Law 100-402 was enacted on August 17 and designated September 15 through October 15 as National His-

panic Heritage Month.

The month also served to celebrate the discovery of America by Christopher Columbus, who was sailing for Spain. Hispanics held presence in North America long before the English staked their claim.

According to the Library of Congress and data from the U.S. Census Bureau, Hispanics constitute almost 20 percent of the nation's total population today. At the current rate, Hispanics will constitute 31 percent of the population, or 128.8 million people, by 2060. People of Mexican descent account for the largest sector of Hispanics in the United States, and only Mexico has a larger Hispanic population than the United States.

Individuals who want to delve further into the rich history of Hispanic culture in the United States can rely on



a number of resources. The Library of Congress, National Endowment for the Humanities, National Gallery of Art, National Park Service, and Smithsonian Institution all have their own archives that catalogue Hispanic migration and achievements. # Pope pauses to give disabled boy a kiss

PHILADELPHIA—Michael Keating, age 10, has had more than his share to bear. Born prematurely, the Bern County boy has cerebral palsy. He can't use his arms or legs. He suffers from seizures, and his brain cannot process what he sees or hears. He has intellectual disabilities. Last year, he had spinal fusion surgery, and in August, doctors replaced his hips. More surgeries are likely.

Yet for all that, Michael's family says he knows joy. He loves music, he loves Shiloh, his black Lab. And he especially loves kisses, lots of kisses. Saturday, Michael received a kiss, a gift, that by now has welled up tears around the world, a story told and retold.

How Pope Francis stopped off the tarmac at Philadelphia International Airport, walked up to a boy in a wheelchair to bless him, and gently placed a kiss on his forehead. Since then, Michael's parents Chuck and Kristin, both teachers, have heard from hundreds of family, friends and former students. "The Today Show" and "Good Morning America" want to interview them. But more than anything else, the family is grateful for the simple, caring gesture of a humble pope.

"Those ringing words continue to inspire us today," the pope said of the Declaration of Independence, "even as they have inspired peoples throughout the world to fight for the freedom to live in accordance with their dignity."

**HE CITED THE ABOLITION** of slavery, the growth of the labor movement and the fight for racial equality as proof that "when a country is determined to remain true to its founding principles, based on respect for human dignity, it is strengthened and renewed."

At the same time, Francis warned that religious freedom is under threat. But it was not the hard-hitting discussion some conservative American bishops may have wanted to hear.

Loath to get dragged into domestic culture wars, the pope did not mention gay marriage, abortion or government-mandated birth control coverage by name, speaking of threats to religious liberty in broader, more global terms. He decried "a world where various forms of modern tyranny seek to suppress religious freedom, or try to reduce it to a subculture without right to a voice in the public square, or to use religion as a pretext for hatred and brutality."

**USING THE OCCASION** instead to embrace other causes close to his heart, Francis encouraged immigrants in the crowd of 40,000 to celebrate their heritage and traditions, and he assured them they are of value to America. "By contributing your gifts, you will not only find your place here, you will help to renew society from within," the first pope from Latin America said in his native Spanish.

Tens of thousands gathered on the wide Benjamin Franklin Parkway for the music-and-prayer festival featuring Aretha Franklin, Italian tenor Andrea Bocelli, actor Mark Wahlberg and comedian Jim Gaffigan. Emcee Wahlberg made joke about his raunchy movie "Ted." Fourteen-year-old Bobby Hill of the Keystone State Boycho performed an opera solo and told Wahlberg that he liked his performance in the movie about an angry talker teddy bear.

Francis came to Philadelphia to close out the World Meeting of Families, a Vatican-sponsored conference of more than 18,000 people from around the world. He found a city practically un-

der lockdown, with blocked-off streets and checkpoints manned by police, National Guardsmen and border agents. There had been fears that visitors might be scared away by the security, and, in fact, train ridership was lower than expected, some streets were eerily quiet, and a vendor of pope sunglasses cut his price from \$15 to \$10 for lack of business.

Wahlberg joked that he told the boy the movie was appropriate for someone his age, and he asked the pop for forgiveness. The Boston-born actor also gave a "Go Eagles" cheer from the stage. It remains to be seen if the expected 1 million people turn out for Francis' final outdoor Mass in the U.S., the Parkway today.

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Good Afternoon:

I am writing to let you know we are planning to file our CT Siting Council application on either December 22 or 23. Copies will be delivered to your office as well as Planning & Zoning, Inland Wetlands, and the Conservation Commission.

We will be sending letters to residents along the proposed Project route and once those have been finalized I will send copies for your records.

Just as a refresher: Eversource is proposing to build a new 115-kV transmission line between the Frostbridge Substation in Watertown and the Campville Substation in Harwinton. The new 10.4 mile transmission line would be on an existing right-of-way. Improvements would also be made at the Frostbridge and the Campville Substations.

The purpose of the Project is to mitigate potential thermal and voltage problems on the transmission system in the NW area of CT. The proposed upgrades will ensure the transmission infrastructure in the NW part of CT is in compliance with regional and national reliability standards.

During the municipal consultation phase of the Project the team performed extensive outreach with property owners along the route. Two Open Houses were held - one in Litchfield and one in Thomaston. Additionally, team members met with many property owners to discuss the Project and the anticipated construction activities on their property. In many instances the team was able to accommodate the property owners request to shift the structure location or the access location to minimize visual impacts or vegetation removal impacts, among other things.

*Ed, the only request the team was not able to incorporate into the design of the Project was the request to change the design of the structures to lower their height. The request was evaluated and it was determined that only a few of the structures would actually be low enough to be below the adjacent tree heights. Additionally, the H-frame structures would require more tree clearing and have greater impacts to wetlands than the proposed monopoles. It is for those reasons the team stayed with the original design.*

Once the CT Siting Council reviews the application they will schedule one or more local public hearings in a town (or towns) along the Project route. They will have 12 months to issue their decision.

If the application is approved construction is scheduled to begin in Q2 2017.

I will keep in touch once we know the CT Siting Council's schedule.

Once the CT Siting Council reviews the application they will schedule one or more local public hearings in a town (or towns) along the Project route. They will have 12 months to issue their decision.

If the application is approved construction is scheduled to begin in Q2 2017.
