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THE CHAIRMAN: Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen. I'd like to call to order this hearing which is the continuation of a hearing that began at 3 o'clock today, Tuesday, August 2, 2016 at 7 p.m. My name is Robin Stein. chairman of the Siting Council. If there's public here that would like to speak, there is a place to sign up there.

Other members of the Council present are Mr. Hannon, designee from the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection; Mr. Levesque, designee from the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority; Mr. Ashton; Dr. Klemens; Mr. Harder; and Mr. Lynch. Members of the staff present, Executive Director/Staff Attorney Melanie Bachman; Mr. Mercier, our siting analyst.

As stated at the outset, this is a continuation of a hearing that started at 3 p.m. Copies of the hearing program and the Citizen's Guide to our procedures are available where you signed in. This hearing is held pursuant to the provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act upon an application from Homeland Towers, LLC and Cellco Partnership d/b/a Verizon

Wireless for a Certificate of Environmental
Compatibility and Public Need for the
construction, maintenance, and operation of a
telecommunications facility located at 100 Pocono
Road, Brookfield, Connecticut. This application

6 was received by the Council on June 6, 2016.

The applicant published notice of the filing of the application to the Council in the News Times on June 2nd and June 3, 2016. The Council's legal notice of the time and date of this hearing was published in the Pennysaver on June 30, 2016. Upon this Council's request, the applicant erected a sign at the proposed site so as to inform the public of the name of the applicant, the type of facility, the hearing date and location, and the contact information for the Council.

This afternoon members of the Council, staff and public personally conducted a field review of the proposed site in order to observe firsthand the potential effects of the proposal.

This hearing tonight is reserved for the public to make their short statements into the record. These public statements are not subject to questions from the parties or the Council, and

- 1 members of the public making statements may not
- 2 ask questions of the parties or the Council.
- 3 These statements will, however, become part of the
- 4 record for our consideration. As mentioned,
- 5 there's a sign-up sheet available for those who
- 6 wish to participate.
- 7 I'd like to ask those making statements
- 8 to confine his or her statements to the subject
- 9 matter before the Council. A verbatim transcript
- 10 will be made of this hearing deposited with the
- 11 Brookfield Town Clerk's Office for the convenience
- 12 of the public.
- And I'll now call on the First
- 14 Selectman, do you want to --
- 15 STEPHEN DUNN: Yes, if I could for a
- 16 minute, just for the record.
- 17 Steve Dunn. I'm the first selectman of
- 18 Brookfield. I was at your meeting this afternoon,
- 19 and the town supports this. And I just wanted to
- 20 reiterate that our fire, ambulance, EMS and public
- 21 works department will all be using this tower. It
- 22 is going to give us much better coverage and
- 23 redundancy that we need. Everyone in the town,
- 24 our planning board, zoning and other boards all
- 25 approve of this and hope that this will move

forward.

The only concern we have is one that came up today, and I thank the Board for mentioning this, is that we absolutely do want to have redundant back-up capability through a generator, and we'll be working with Ray Vergati of Homeland and Verizon to achieve that. It's very important for the town to do that.

So thank you very much. I appreciate the time and effort you put into this. It's clear you spent a lot of time on this, and the town appreciates it. Thank you.

THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you.

The next speaker, Mr. Dembowski.

GREG DEMBOWSKI: I'm Greg Dembowski, 28
Greenknoll Drive in Brookfield. Last name is
D-E-M-B-O-W-S-K-I.

I have three questions, if I may ask them. And this may be a part of the record already, and I apologize if it is, and I was just not following this project close enough.

So, if I can, I'd like to ask three questions. The first is about lighting. The reason why I'm asking the question is our house faces east on the other side of the valley, so we

- 1 look into the firehouse. And since we see that
- 2 firehouse, we know we're going to see the cell
- 3 tower. I'm in support of it as well, but I do
- 4 have three questions since I'll be seeing it from
- 5 my bedroom window.
- 6 Lighting. Is there going to be
- 7 lighting on this tower? Are there going to be
- 8 flashing red lights, or how is it going to be lit,
- 9 if at all?
- 10 My second question is about what's this
- 11 tower going to look like. Is it going to have all
- 12 kinds of dishes hanging off of it? Is it going to
- 13 have equipment hanging off it, or is it going to
- 14 be a simple straight up tower?
- 15 And my third question is about future
- 16 changes and additions to the tower. If there's
- 17 any changes to that tower, either in height or
- 18 additional equipment placed on it, will there be
- 19 more public notification and comment before any
- 20 changes are made to it?
- Those are my three questions. Thank
- 22 you very much.
- THE CHAIRMAN: First, let me see, we
- 24 don't have anybody else who signed up to speak.
- 25 So are there any other speakers?

1 (No response.) THE CHAIRMAN: So I think you're 2 fortunate. At least we'll try, between myself and 3 maybe ask the applicant to answer, and the 4 5 applicant can correct me also. I believe on the issue of lighting of 6 7 the tower there will be none. 8 MR. BALDWIN: Correct. 9 MICHAEL LIBERTINE: Correct. THE CHAIRMAN: What it will look like, 10 we have information. Do you have a -- we can show 11 12 you. Can you show us what the tower will look like? 13 14 ROBERT BURNS: Yes, and the elevation. 15 THE CHAIRMAN: After we close the 16 hearing, if you can stay, and you can explain in more detail to Mr. Dembowski. 17 18 Is that okay with you? 19 MR. BURNS: Sure. The third question is 20 THE CHAIRMAN: about future changes. Well, it's somewhat of an 21 open-ended question. There are certain -- if they 22 replace -- why don't you explain it. That's why I 23 24 have an attorney sitting next to me.

MS. BACHMAN: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

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Certainly right now the only carrier that is going to be located on the tower is However, the tower is designed for four Verizon. carriers and the Town of Brookfield and their emergency communications equipment. So certainly if this Council decides to approve the tower, other carriers do have the option of submitting to the Council a request for a tower share. It would be a public filing, and they have to give us all the same details of the original applicant has provided to us, where they're going to be located, what size are the antennas, what associated equipment, and that would have to come before the full Council to vote to approve the tower sharing.

I will note that the state does have a tower sharing policy, and they encourage the sharing of towers. In the event that they need to increase the height of the tower to accommodate another entity, and if they increase it more than 10 percent -- this is 150-foot tower. So if the increase in height is 15 feet, the Federal Communications Commission does have a nondiscretionary program where if it is only a 10 percent increase, they could submit something to us to indicate that through the FCC, the program

to increase the height of the tower, and they

could do it that way. But if it's over 10

percent, they have to come back to this Council

with what's called a petition for a declaratory

ruling.

Certainly it's also a public filing, and we accept comments on either something that's submitted through the FCC program or something that's submitted as a petition to increase the height more than 10 percent. And it would be public, and it would have to go through the full Council which we ordinarily make decisions at regular meetings that we hold every two weeks, but the decision would not be rendered any earlier than 30 to 60 days from the date it's filed. So if you did have comments, certainly we'd be receptive to those comments in the future.

MR. DEMBOWSKI: Thank you.

THE CHAIRMAN: I don't know if I fully answered your question on lighting because I think you asked about the tower. No lighting on the tower. But will there be some security lighting on the compound? Maybe somebody --

MR. BURNS: Yes, there will be lights on a motion detector around the equipment

platform.

THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. I think that covers it. Again, you have a whole team representing the applicants. So I'm sure if you have even more questions or want clarification, they can provide the details to you.

And I don't see anybody else from the public.

Is there anybody else from the public who wants to speak?

(No response.)

THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. If not, I'll now close the public comment session of the hearing.

I just want to state that briefs -which this would really affect the applicant -may be filed with the Council no later than
September 1st of this year. The submission of
briefs is not required, but we leave it to you.

Anyone who is not here but who -- if you have any neighbors who wish to make his or her views known to the Council, they may file a written statement with the Council within 30 days of the date hereof.

The Council will issue draft findings of fact, and thereafter the party may identify

errors or inconsistencies. Again, copies of the transcript of this hearing and the hearing earlier today will be filed with the Brookfield Town Clerk's Office. And I hereby declare the hearing adjourned. Thank you all for your participation, and drive home safely. Thank you. (Whereupon, the above proceedings concluded at 7:13 p.m.)
