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THE CHAIRMAN: Good evening, ladies
and gentlemen. First of all, if anybody would
like to speak on this, there's a sign-up sheet
over there, so please sign up.

I'd like to call to order this
meeting of the Connecticut Siting Council, today
Thursday, October 6, 2016, at 7 p.m. My name is
Robin Stein. I'm Chairman of the Siting Council.
Other members of the Council present are
Mr. Hannon who's designee from the Department of
Energy and Environmental Protection; Mr. Ashton;
Dr. Klemens; and Mr. Lynch.

Members of the staff; Melanie
Bachman, our Executive Director Staff Attorney;
and Michael Perrone, our siting analyst.

This is a continuation of a public hearing that began at 3 p.m. this afternoon.

Copies of the hearing program and the Council's citizen guide to Siting Council procedures are available for members of the public.

This hearing is held pursuant to the provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act upon an application from Cellco partnership d/b/a Verizon for a certificate of

environmental compatibility and public need for the construction, maintenance and operation of a telecommunications facility located at 520 Bailey Hill Road in Killingly, Connecticut.

The application was received by the Council on July 26, 2016. This application is also governed by the Telecommunication Act of 1996 which is administered by the Federal Communications Commission. This act prohibits the Council from considering the health effects of radiofrequency emissions on human health and wildlife to the extent the emissions from towers are within the federal acceptable safe limit standards, which standard is also followed by the State Department of Public Health.

The federal act also prohibits this

Council from discriminating between and amongst

providers of functionally equivalent services.

This means that if one carrier already provides

service for an area, other carriers have the right

to compete and provide service in the same area.

The applicant published notice of the filing of the application to the Council in the Bulletin on July 21 and July 22, 2016. The Council's legal notice of the date and time of

this hearing was published in the Bulletin on September 6, 2016.

Upon this Council's request, the applicant erected a sign at the proposed site so as to inform the public of the of name of the applicant, type of facility, hearing date and location and contact information for the Council.

This afternoon members of the Council, staff and public personally conducted a field review of the proposed site in order to observe firsthand the potential effects of the proposal.

This hearing session tonight has been reserved first for the public to make short statements into the record. These public statements are not subject to questions from the party or Council, and members of the public making statements may not ask questions of the party or Council. These statements will become part of the record for the Council's consideration.

As I mentioned before, there's a sign-up sheet next to the door for those who would like to speak.

24 As a reminder to all,
25 off-the-record communication with a member of the

Council or a member of the Council's staff upon the merits of this application is prohibited by law.

I also wish to note for those who are here and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors who are unable to join us for the public comment session, that you or they may send written statements to the Council within 30 days of the date hereof and such written statements will be given the same weight as if spoken at this hearing.

Again, I ask each person making a public statement to confine his or her statements to the subject matter before the Council. Please be advised the Council cannot answer questions from the public about the proposal.

A verbatim transcript will be made of this hearing and deposited at the Killingly Town Clerk's office for the convenience of the public.

Is there any public official who wishes to speak?

24 THE CHAIRMAN: Hearing and seeing 25 none. Okay. We'll go right in. We have -- and I'll apologize, Mr. Rzucidlo, If I mispronounce
your name, but if you would come up to the podium
and spell your last name for the stenographer, it
would be appreciated.

- DAVID RZUCIDLO: Last name is

 Rzucidlo, R-z-u-c-i-d-l-o. My name is Dave. I

 live about a half a mile from where the cell phone
 tower is proposed to be built. I just have a few
 comments about it.
 - Number one, and I'm sure everybody is aware of it already, but it is a residential area. We built our home there 25 years ago based on the zoning regulations in Killingly which didn't allow any building or structure higher than 35 feet. And we recently built a building and they came out and measured it, and it can't be over 35 feet tall. So this cell phone tower is going to be 150 feet tall.
 - I know that -- I did go by the site today. The top of the tower will be visible from the road. The gentleman that was there said that there are some deciduous trees around the cellphone tower, but when all the leaves are down it's definitely going to be noticeable.

I walk that road almost every day,

especially through the wintertime to get out in the fresh air. And I just -- I don't really see the reasoning for putting it in a residential area and having people in a residential area having to deal with a 150-foot tower.

When I got the notice in the mail -- I do know quite a bit about the property. There is 649 acres of land on this property, and I'm sure my testimony is not going to sway anybody or make that big of a difference as to if the tower is built or not, but for the respect of the people in the residential zone, you know, if the Council decided that they thought that there was a need for this cellphone tower on Bailey Hill Road, that there's 649 acres of land available.

And it could be -- I've seen plenty of other cellphone towers quite a ways off the road, that you don't see the tower. And I don't see the need of having it 600 feet from the road and everybody that has to go by it and look at it. It's not that -- it might not be a health risk or anything to anybody, but I just don't want to look at it.

I mean, I didn't move into a residential area and build my house there to have

- 1 a 150-foot tower built right down the Street.
- 2 When I came to the Town and tried to talk to the
- 3 zoning people they informed me that they had
- 4 nothing to do with the approval of this cell phone
- 5 site. It was the Connecticut Siting Council and
- 6 that it was out of their hands.
- 7 And their response to me, well, was
- 8 you've got a cell phone. Don't you? So I don't
- 9 know what that meant. If maybe I should put up
- 10 with having a cellphone tower in my neighborhood
- 11 because I use a cellphone, but -- and my cellphone
- 12 works fine and I live on Bailey Hill Road. So
- 13 I've never had any problem with any kind of
- 14 reception or anything.
- But my main issue is, is that I
- 16 really -- I don't know how many other sites these
- 17 cellphone, LLC, people, how many other sites
- 18 they've looked at, if there's any other commercial
- 19 sites. I know there's a couple of towers over on
- 20 Route 6. I don't really know what the zoning is
- 21 there, but I really don't see, like, why the tower
- 22 couldn't be with other towers.
- Or maybe up on North Road, there's
- 24 towers up there. Put them where the towers are,
- 25 or not in the middle of a residential area so that

- the people in the residential area have to deal with it.
- Thank you.
- 4 THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Thank you
- 5 very much.
- Nobody else has signed up, but is
- 7 there anybody else who would like to speak?
- 8 (No response.)
- 9 THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. And we'll
- 10 certainly take those comments that you made into
- 11 consideration. The Council will not be acting
- 12 tonight. We'll take, as I said, comments and also
- what we heard at the hearing this afternoon, and
- 14 subsequently we'll go through a process of making
- 15 a final decision.
- 16 So before closing this hearing I'd
- 17 like to announce that briefs and findings of fact
- 18 may be filed by the Council, I guess, in this case
- 19 the applicant no later than November 7, 2016.
- 20 Submission of briefs or finding of fact is not
- 21 required by the Council, rather we leave it to the
- 22 choice of the applicant.
- 23 Again, anyone who has not become a
- 24 party to this, but who desires to make his or her
- 25 views known to the Council may file written

statements with the Council within 30 days of today's date. The Council will, as I just mentioned, will issue draft findings of fact and thereafter the applicant and, I guess, anyone else can identify errors or inconsistencies, and the Council can then finally make a final determination. Copies of the transcript of the hearing will be filed in the Killingly Town Clerk's office. And I'd like to declare this hearing adjourned. Thank you all for your participation. For those of us who live far away, drive home safely. (Whereupon, the above proceedings were concluded at 7:13 p.m.)
