RE: **DOCKET NO. 470B** – NTE Connecticut, LLC application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a 550-megawatt dual-fuel combined cycle electric generating facility and associated electrical interconnection switchyard located at 180 and 189 Lake Road, Killingly, Connecticut. Reopening of this application based on changed conditions pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §4-181a(b).

1. Motions

During a public hearing of the Connecticut Siting Council (Council) held on April 4, 2019, the Council ruled on the following motion:

NTE's Motion for Protective Order, dated March 28, 2019

The motion was granted by the Council.

2. Continuation of Evidentiary Hearing

The Connecticut Siting Council (Council) shall continue the evidentiary hearing for the above-referenced proceeding on Thursday, April 18, 2019, in Hearing Room One, Ten Franklin Square, New Britain, Connecticut, beginning at 11:00 a.m.

The hearing shall commence with the continued cross examination of the applicant by the Council and the intervenors and thereafter with the appearance of the intervenors for cross-examination by the Council and the applicant.

To save the time and expense of the parties and the public, and to conclude this proceeding in a timely fashion, additional pre-filed testimony as well as any supplemental information requested from the applicant during the April 4, 2019 hearing should be submitted to the Council on or before April 11, 2019. The **final deadline** for the submission of pre-filed testimony shall be April 11, 2019. This applies to all parties and intervenors.

3. NTE Connecticut, LLC Late-Filed Exhibits

During the April 4, 2019 evidentiary hearing, the Council requested the Applicant submit the following information as late-filed exhibits:

- a) Provide a copy of any correspondence to the Department of Public Health and the response thereto regarding the construction sequence (relative to the proposed construction of KEC) for the water supply interconnection between Connecticut Water Company's (CWC) Crystal System and Plainfield System;



- b) Provide a response as to whether or not CWC will have to modify its water supply plan;
- c) Convert the approximately 110,000 million BTUs per day of natural gas supply to standard cubic feet of natural gas per day;
- d) Estimate the capacity factor for the duct burner;
- e) Indicate if the proposed site was previously used for agricultural purposes and approximately when in the past that occurred, if known;
- f) Provide the full-load ultra-low sulfur distillate (ULSD) consumption rate in gallons per hour and calculate the maximum full-load run time (currently estimated at 45.7 hours) based on the 1,000,000-gallon ULSD storage tank (assuming no refueling); and
- g) With ULSD refueling, the current estimate is two truck loads of ULSD to be delivered per hour. Please confirm the number of truck loads of ULSD to be delivered to the plant per hour and if that can support the full load consumption rate indicated above in (f). Also confirm if the Department of Transportation (DOT) or other rules limit the weight and therefore the number of gallons that each refueling truck can hold (e.g. 7,700 gallons per truck).

The Council requests these late-filed exhibits be submitted to the Council before the close of business on **April 11, 2019**.

Any request for an extension of time to submit late-filed exhibits shall be submitted to the Council in writing pursuant to §16-50j-22a of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies.
