1 SENATOR MURPHY: Ladies and gentlemen, I'd like to call this hearing to order this 2 Tuesday, August the 22nd, 2017, at approximately 3 6:30 p.m. My name is James J. Murphy, Jr. 4 5 vice chairman of the Connecticut Siting Council. Other members of the Council are Robert 6 7 Hannon, designee for Commissioner Robert Klee of 8 the Department of Energy and Environmental 9 Protection; Larry Levesque, the designee for 10 Chairwoman Katie Dykes with the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority; Robert Silvestri; Dr. 11 Michael W. Klemens; Michael Harder; and Daniel P. 12 13 Lynch, Jr. Members of the staff with us tonight are Melanie Bachman, Executive Director and Staff 14 15 Attorney; and Michael Perrone, our siting analyst. 16 This is a continuation of a public 17 hearing that began at 3 p.m. this afternoon. 18 Copies of the hearing program and the Council's Citizens Guide to siting Council Procedures are 19 available for members of the public over here. 20 This hearing is held pursuant to the 21 provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General 22 Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative 23 24 Procedures Act upon an application from The

Connecticut Light and Power Company d/b/a

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- 1 Eversource Energy for a Certificate of
- 2 Environmental Compatibility and Public Need for

8 The applicant published notice of the

9 filing of this application to the Council in The

10 | Hartford Courant and the West Hartford News on May

11 4th, and May the 11th 2017. The Council's legal

12 notice of the date and time of this hearing was

published in The Hartford Courant on July the

14 25th, 2017. Upon this Council's request, the

15 applicant erected signs at conspicuous locations

16 along the proposed and all-underground alternative

17 routes so as to inform the public of the name of

the applicant, the type of facility, the hearing

date and it's location, and contact information

20 for this Council.

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21 This afternoon members of the Council,

22 staff, and the public personally conducted a field

23 review of the proposed project in order to observe

24 firsthand the potential impact of this proposal.

The hearing session tonight has been

reserved first for the public to make short statements into the record. These public statements are not subject to questions from the parties or the Council, and members of the public making statements may not ask questions of the parties or the Council. These statements will become part of the record for the Council's consideration.

A sign-up sheet is available for those who would like to participate. And I think that sign-up sheet is over here at the podium.

As a reminder to all, off the record communications with members of this Council or a member of the Council's staff, upon the merits of this application, is prohibited by the law.

I wish to note that the parties and intervenors, including their representatives and witnesses, are not allowed to participate in the public comment session. I also wish to note for those who are here, and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors who are unable to join us for this public comment session, that you or they may send written statements to the Council within 30 days of the date hereof; and such written statements will be given the same weight as if

spoken this evening. If necessary, party and intervenor cross-examination that began at the hearing session held at 3 this afternoon may continue after the public comments.

This evening we ask each person making a public statement in this proceeding to confine his or her statements to the subject matter before the Council, and to avoid unreasonable repetition so that we may hear all of the concerns you or your neighbors may have. Please be advised that the Council cannot answer questions from the public about the proposal.

A verbatim transcript will be made of this hearing and deposited at the Newington and West Hartford Town Clerk's Office and the Hartford City Clerk's Office for the convenience of the public.

Before I call on members of the public to make statements, we're asking the applicant to make a brief presentation to the public here this evening describing the proposed project, why it is necessary, and what alternatives you investigated.

KENNETH BOWES: Thank you, Chairman.

My name is Kenneth Bowes. I'm the vice president

of transmission performance for Eversource Energy,

and also the lead witness for this proceeding.

The Greater Hartford Central

Connecticut Reliability Project was developed in response to a need for transmission system improvements identified by ISO New England, the independent system operator. The project will address the needs, both thermal and voltage issues, and enhance the reliability of the electric system.

The proposed project has several components as follows: A new 115 kV transmission line, which would extend a distance of approximately 3.7 miles from Eversource's substation in Newington, Connecticut, located at 185 Cherry Hill Drive, through the Town of West Hartford to the Southwest Hartford Substation located at 219 New Park Avenue in the City of Hartford.

The new transmission line will provide a transmission line between these two substations that are presently not connected. Modifications to accommodate the new transmission line at both Newington and Southwest Substations are part of this project as well. The reconfiguration of one of the existing 115 kV transmission lines at

Newington Substation is also part of this application.

The project route travels through the Newington Substation to the Amtrak right-of-way, approximately 1.3 miles in Newington. This portion of the project will be installed underground for approximately 0.8 miles along an existing Eversource right-of-way, which has five distribution circuits for about 0.14 miles along the State Highway 173, Willard Avenue, and then for about 0.13 miles along a local road, Shepard Drive. At that point we will go onto the existing Amtrak and Fastrak right-of-way for 2.4 miles, including 0.17 miles in Newington, 1.64 miles in West Hartford, and 0.56 miles in Hartford.

The Amtrak right-of-way currently has two Amtrak rail lines, as well as the recently developed Fastrak bus lane, which extends along the west side of the right-of-way. This new 115 kV transmission line has been carefully designed in consultation with Amtrak to avoid impacts of both of these rail lines, Amtrak's future plans for expansion of rail service, and also the bus route.

The transmission structures along this

Amtrak right-of-way generally range from 95 to 110 There are two new -- or two modifications feet. to the existing application around what would be a new rail station in West Hartford. At either end of the overhead segment there's a transition structure where there's transition from overhead to underground. Those will be approximately 95 to 105 feet tall.

The substation and Newington Tap modifications include expansion of the fence lines entirely on Eversource owned property. Each will be approximately 0.3 acres. Overall, Eversource has designed this project to carefully balance the need for improvements to the electric system, and the avoidance and minimization of impacts to the public, to the environment, to cultural resources and for provision of a cost-effective solution. The use of this hybrid transmission line with an overhead and underground segments saves ratepayers approximately \$39 million versus the all-underground alternative. Thank you.

SENATOR MURPHY: Thank you. We'll now turn to the public portion of the hearing this evening.

Is there any elected officials who

would like to address us from the public? 1 2 (No response.) SENATOR MURPHY: If not, as it stands 3 now, I have one person that is signed up. 4 So if 5 other people are interested in speaking this evening, I urge you to put your name on the sheet 6 7 if you're interested. If not, that's fine. 8 Jonathan -- I'm not sure of the last 9 name -- Morreale? 10 JACQUES MORREALE: My name is Jacques 11 Morreale. 12 SENATOR MURPHY: Spell your last name 13 for us, and address, please. 14 JACQUES MORREALE: My name is Jacques 15 Morreale. I live at 123 Cherry Hill Drive. here today --16 17 SENATOR MURPHY: In which town, 18 Newington? 19 JACQUES MORREALE: Newington, yes. I'm here today just to see what you had 20 I'm glad to see that you had intended to 21 in mind. put it down underneath the existing lines through 22 23 my neighborhood. 24 One of my biggest concerns was that if

you put up a high power line, you'd be able to see

it anywhere in the neighborhood, and it would ruin the property values. So I'm against power lines.

The portion that runs along the

Fastrak, I was so happy to see Fastrak go in,

because that was just a terrible area, and Fastrak

cleaned it all up. It's quite nice now.

And I'm afraid if the power lines go in at heights that you just described, that it would look bad and make the town, not only Hartford, but also Newington, look bad when you drive by you can see the power lines. They're huge.

If there's some way to put them underground, that's all I would like to say. If they put them underground there, keep it all underground in the route that they intended, I think that would be most preferable to the aesthetics of the towns involved.

SENATOR MURPHY: Thank you.

I lost my list. Is there anyone else who would care to address us this evening?

(No response.)

SENATOR MURPHY: If not, the Council will now close the public comment session of this hearing and resume the evidentiary session of the hearing that began this afternoon.

Do we have anything left unattended to,

Mr. Fitzgerald?

MR. FITZGERALD: No, Senator Murphy, I don't believe so, from our point of view. We rest.

SENATOR MURPHY: I'm going to close this hearing, evidentiary, as well as the public hearing.

Before closing this hearing, the

Connecticut Siting Council announces that briefs
and proposed findings of fact may be filed with
the Council by any party or intervenor no later
than September the 21st, 2017. The submission of
briefs or proposed findings of fact are not
required by the Council, rather, we leave it to
the choice of the parties and intervenors.

Anyone who has not become a party or intervenor, but who desires to make his or her views known to this Council, may file written statements with the Council within 30 days of the date hereof.

The council will issue draft findings of fact, and thereafter the parties and intervenors may identify errors or inconsistencies between the Council's draft findings of fact and

the record. However, no new information, no new evidence, no new argument, and no reply briefs without our permission will be considered by the Council. Copies of this evening's transcript will be filed at the Newington and West Hartford Town Clerk's Office and the Hartford City Clerk's Office. I hereby declare this hearing adjourned. Thank you for your participation, and drive carefully. (Whereupon, the above proceedings were adjourned at 6:48 p.m.)
