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1 SENATOR MURPHY: Ladies and gentlemen, I'd like to call this meeting to order of the 2 Siting Council this Tuesday, December the 12th, 3 2017, at 6:30 p.m. My name is James J. Murphy, 4 5 Jr. I'm Vice Chairman of the Connecticut Siting Council. 6 7 Other members of the Council here 8 tonight are Robert Hannon, designee for 9 Commissioner Robert Klee of the Department of 10 Energy and Environmental Protection; Larry Levesque, designee for Chairman Katie Dykes of the 11 12 Public Utilities Regulatory Authority; Robert 13 Silvestri; Edward Edelson; Michael Harder; and Daniel P. Lynch, Jr. 14 15 Members of the staff are Melanie 16 Bachman, our executive director and staff 17 attorney; and Robert Mercier, the siting analyst 18 on this particular docket. 19 This is a continuation of a public

hearing that began at 3 p.m. this afternoon.

Copies of the hearing program and the Council's

Citizens Guide to Siting Council Procedures are

available for members of the public. They're on

the table back by the podium.

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25 This hearing is held pursuant to the

- 1 provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General
- 2 Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative
- 3 Procedure Act upon an application from Cellco
- 4 Partnership d/b/a Verizon Wireless for a
- 5 Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and
- 6 Public Need for the construction, maintenance, and
- 7 operation of a telecommunications facility located
- 8 at 46 Cemetery Road, Canterbury, Connecticut.
- 9 This application was received by the Council on
- 10 August the 23rd, 2017.
- 11 This application is also governed by
- 12 the Telecommunications Act of 1996, which is
- administered by the Federal Communications
- 14 Commission. This act prohibits this Council from
- 15 considering the health effects of radio frequency
- 16 emissions on human health and wildlife to the
- 17 extent the emissions from towers are within the
- 18 federal acceptable safe limits standard, which
- 19 standard is also followed by the State of
- 20 Connecticut Department of Public Health. The
- 21 federal act also prohibits this Council from
- 22 discriminating between and amongst providers of
- 23 functionally equivalent services. This means, in
- 24 effect, that if one carrier already provides
- 25 service for an area, other carriers have a right

to compete and provide service in the same area.

The applicant published notice of the filing of the application to this Council in The Norwich Bulletin on August 17 and 18, 2017. The Council's legal notice of the date and time of this hearing was published in The Norwich Bulletin on September 26, 2017.

Upon the request of the Council, the applicant erected a sign at the proposed site so as to inform the public of the name of the applicant, the type of facility, the date, time and location of this hearing, and contact information for the Council. This afternoon members of the Council, staff and public personally conducted a field review of the proposed site in order to observe firsthand the potential effects of this proposal.

The hearing session tonight has been reserved first for the public to make statements into the record. These public statements are not subject to questions from the parties or the Council, and members of the public making statements may not ask questions of the parties or the Council. These statements will become part of the record for Council consideration. A sign-up

sheet is available for those who would like to participate.

A reminder to all, off-the-record communications with members of the Council, or a member of the Council staff, upon the merits of this application is prohibited by law.

I wish to note for those who are here, and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors who are unable to join us for this public comment session, that you or they may send written statements to the Council within 30 days of the date hereof; and such written statements will be given the same weight as if spoken at the hearing this evening.

We ask each person making a public statement in this proceeding to confine his or her statements to the subject matter before the Council and to avoid unreasonable repetition so that we may hear all of the concerns you and your neighbors may have. Please be advised that the Council cannot answer questions from the public about the proposal.

A verbatim transcript will be made of this hearing and deposited at the Canterbury Town Clerk's Office for the convenience of the public. Before I call on the public to testify,

I would ask the applicant to have someone make a

brief overview of the proposal.

Mr. Baldwin, is someone available?

MR. BALDWIN: We are. Dave Weinpahl,
our engineer.

SENATOR MURPHY: Thank you.

THE WITNESS (Weinpahl): Good evening.

My name is David Weinpahl. I'm project engineer

for Verizon Wireless.

This proposed application is situated in the southwest corner of the underlying parcel. It consists of a 50 foot square fenced compound with a proposed monopole tower 160 feet in height within the compound. There will be nine antennas for Verizon Wireless at the top of the tower at 157 foot center line. There are also additional radio heads on a platform at the top of the tower.

Ground equipment for Verizon consists of a 16 by 9'4" equipment platform at the base with radio cabinets and a generator.

The access to the facility is utilizing the owner's existing paved access drive before turning into a gravel access drive that will be extended into the fenced compound.

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All utilities to the facility will be

    work. I missed the 3 o'clock. I don't know what

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The Siting Council needs to understand

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the 41.8 acres that is involved in this, that already has an existing environmental issue. The land is eroding into the lake. So to put another structure on top of this hill, all the water runs down. This actual structure, the property goes behind, my property, that has the actual aquifer that is on top of the land that holds all the water for hundreds of acres. So to reward somebody to build another structure on a piece of land that already has an environmental issue --

I know that the Council went up and looked at the site. But just because it's a leased site, you can't ignore the environmental issue on the 41 acres that this site would be on because the environmental issue on this 41 acres is, I believe, and the family believes, tied to the leased land. So any structures that go on this property are going to continue to erode and do further damage to the existing lake.

It's a 20 acre man-made lake that is stream fed. It's been in our family for 96 years. My grandfather actually built it. So for a billion dollar industry to ruin -- they're not going to ruin it, but the environmental issue that is on that land is only going to get disrupted

further. It's not going to go away until the
proper courses are taken for the environmental
issue that is in effect.

We also sent in pictures. I don't know, I think the Council got it. That would be my family. My mother got put in the hospital today, so my family is there. I'm here. I believe you guys did get that, so I'm assuming you'll have that. But I speak for the whole family at this particular point because there's 30 of us. To get everybody here tonight would be probably a waste of time. I'd rather have somebody tell me where I should go with this conversation.

But the existing environmental issue is more of the reason. You know, to get anybody involved to come and see the issue on that land has been like pulling teeth. The DEP, I think the best way to say it is this friend of mine, I've known him for years. That's how I know the problem exists. You can kayak right by it and see it. The Council wants facts. The fact is, when we kayak in the water and you look underneath your boat, the land has slid 6 feet to 10 feet into the lake. The initial silt fence that was put on that

property 15 years ago got buried by the silt that ran off that property. Then they put up another silt fence that got buried. And now we put up a third silt fence.

So any work that gets done on that land erodes down into the lake. And that lake shore is almost two acres of pure silt right now. It's probably 2 to 3 feet deep. So to have another structure put on this property at this point, minuscule as they make it sound, for financial gains, there's no purpose or a tax value. There's not going to be (inaudible) off this cell tower.

look at them, we own literally a couple hundred acres all around that land. So a detriment. The pictures I have are from our kitchen windows from three of our houses. We look at this cell tower. There's a 4 foot balloon that you're seeing today. But if you -- I have pictures here that I could display that if you were in that balloon and you look down over the 100 acres and the 20 acres below you, they have the most multi-million dollar view from the balloon onto our property. So if the property values, just on our sake, if we wanted to sell the land, we have to put in houses,

which would be multiple house lots. People want to buy that million dollar view. Does anyone want to buy a house for a million dollars to look at a cell tower?

- it's back in the woods. It's right in our front yard because we can see it out of all our windows, all three of our houses. So it would be a constant reminder. Once again, big business, you know, that's what it's all about, I guess. It's not really about the environment or the community or the heritage for 96 years.
 - So I remember the last statement here. Historical will be like 100 years. Well, this year is our 96th year since my grandfather purchased the property in 1921. So I guess we fell four years short of fitting criterias.
 - So, I mean, I don't know what else I have to say, but I have pictures. I wanted to be here earlier, but I deliver oil. I was out on the road. I just got here. I didn't shower or eat yet. So I know you can't ask questions, but I can lay out pictures. You wanted facts. These are the facts I have. So thank you.

SENATOR MURPHY: Thank you, Mr. Thoma.

As I indicated, no one else has signed up.

Is there anyone else here who wants to be heard before the Siting Council this evening?

(No response.)

SENATOR MURPHY: If not, we're going to close the public session here.

And before closing this hearing, the Connecticut Siting Council announces that briefs and proposed findings of fact may be filed with the Council no later than January the 11th, 2018.

Anyone who desires to make his or her views known to the Council may file written statements with the Council within 30 days of the date hereof.

The Council will issue draft findings of fact, and thereafter the applicant may identify errors or inconsistencies between the Council's draft findings of fact and the record. However, no new information, no new evidence, no arguments, and no reply briefs, without our permission, will be considered without the Council's approval.

Copies of the transcript of this hearing will be filed with the Canterbury Town Clerk.
