THE CHAIRMAN: Good evening, ladies and gentlemen. I'd like to call to order this meeting of the Connecticut Siting Council today, Thursday, January 11, 2018, at approximately 6:30 p.m. My name is Robin Stein. I'm Chairman of the Connecticut Siting Council.

Other members of the Council present are Senator Murphy, our vice chairman; Mr. Hannon, designee for Commissioner Klee of the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection;
Mr. Levesque, designee for Katie Dykes from the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority;
Mr. Silvestri; Mr. Edelson; Mr. Lynch; and Dr. Klemens.

Members of the staff present are

Melanie Bachman, our executive director and staff
attorney; and Robert Mercier, our siting analyst.

This is a continuation of a public hearing that began at 3 p.m. this afternoon.

Copies of the hearing program and Council's Citizens Guide to Siting Council Procedures are available for members of the public. In addition, there's a sign-up sheet in the back for those who choose to sign up to speak.

This hearing is held pursuant to the

provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act upon an application from Eco-Site, Inc. and T-Mobile Northeast, LLC for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a telecommunications facility proposed to be located at 63 Woodland Street, Glastonbury, Connecticut. This application was received by the Council on 

September 18, 2017.

This application is also governed by the Telecommunications Act of 1996, with is administered by the Federal Communications

Commission. This act prohibits this Council from considering the health effects of radio frequency emissions on human health and wildlife to the extent the emissions from towers are within the federal acceptable safe limits standard, which standard is also followed by the state Department of Public Health. The Federal Act also prohibits the Council from discriminating between and amongst providers of functionally equivalent services. This means that if one carrier already provides service for an area, other carriers have a right to compete and provide service to the same

area.

The applicant published notice of the filing of the application to the Council in The Hartford Courant on September 5 and September 6, 2017. The Council's legal notice of the date and time of this hearing was published in The Hartford Courant on November 1, 2017. Upon this Council's request, the applicant erected a sign at the proposed site so as to inform the public of the name of the applicant, the type of facility, the hearing date and location, and contact information for the Council.

This afternoon members of the Council, staff and public personally conducted a field review of the proposed site in order to observe firsthand the potential effects of the proposal.

This hearing session tonight has been reserved for the public to make short statements into the record. These public statements are not subject to questions from the parties or the Council, and members of the public making statements may not ask questions of the parties or the Council. These statements will become part of the record for Council consideration. Again, there's a sign-up sheet in the back for those who

wish to participate.

As a reminder to all, off-the-record communication with a member of the Council or a member of the Council's staff upon the merits of this application is prohibited by law.

I wish to note that parties, including their representatives and witnesses, are not allowed to participate in the public comment session. I also wish to note for those who are here, and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors who are unable to join us for the public comment session, that you or they may send written statements to the Council within 30 days of the date hereof, and such written statements will be given the same weight as if spoken at the hearing.

We ask each person making a public statement in this proceeding to confine his or her statements to the subject matter before the Council, and to avoid unreasonable repetition so we may hear all the concerns you and your neighbors may have. Please be advised that the Council cannot answer questions from the public about the proposal.

A verbatim transcript will be made of this hearing and deposited with the Glastonbury

Town Clerk's Office for the convenience of the public.

Before I call on members of the public to make a statement, I'd like to request the applicant to make a brief presentation describing where the facility is proposed, why it's necessary, and the alternatives that were investigated.

MR. DESANTIS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

My name is A.J. DeSantis with Infinigy Engineering. We're the design firm contracted to do the design work for the proposed telecommunication site located at 63 Woodland Street in Glastonbury, Connecticut.

The site is located on a large parcel which is currently used for agricultural purposes. The proposed site will be located to the southwest of the parcel. Access to the site will be via a 20 foot wide access and utility easement utilizing an existing drive that exists for approximately 3,750 feet, where at that point it will turn south towards the site in a new access drive for approximately 650 feet.

The setbacks for the tower. Given the large size of this parcel, the three setbacks that

we wanted to represent are the closer setbacks,
most notably to the south it's 485 feet directly
to the south, to the east it's approximately 1,525
feet, and to the west it's approximately 795 feet.

The next sheet here that I'd like to present has a close-up view of what the fenced compound and facility would actually look like. My colorings are just made so that the line work jumps off the paper a little bit more. The orange line represents the gravel access drive that would be installed. The brown dashed lines represent the lease area and the access easement. the lease area, the 100 by 100 lease area, there will be a 50 foot by 50 foot fenced compound that will surround any of the proposed telecommunications ground equipment, as well as the monopole tower itself. T-Mobile has proposed an equipment pad in the southeast corner of the fenced equipment compound.

And lastly, the elevation diagram shows that the tower, the proposed tower, will be a monopole tower, meaning that it will have one -- it will appear as one vertical structure with different antenna arrays should future carriers colocate. This proposal includes T-Mobile at the

  2 being 150 feet. Again, the ground equipment will
  3 have a chain link fence surrounding it all within

I'll now call on those only two people
who signed the list. The first, Mr. Jim Mahoney.

Thank you.

- When you go to the podium, would you
  please spell your last name so we make sure we get
  it correctly for the stenographer?

  - So I'm going to make a statement. I think cell towers are a fact of life. I don't have any opinion of what they look like, whether it's a pine tree or a little Eiffel Tower. It
    - I have a degree from the University of Hartford in electronics, 27 years with the federal government as an electronics technician, and now I work with the institute -- I work with people at the International Institute for Building Biology and Ecology, and I do some testing for them.

1 So my concern is microwave radiation. 2 So basically I'd like to welcome everybody to the experiment. You're in it. You can't opt out. 3 We're not going to know the real dangers until 4 5 time, you know. I mean, there's so little time that has been devoted to research now. 6 I mean, the iPhone is just ten years old. Wait five years 7 8 and see what happens. 9 I have a poster at home. It says by 10 three independent studies more doctors smoke Camel cigarettes than any other brand. Those are 11 12 independent studies. So you're going to get 13 independent studies that are funded by the telecommunications industry, and you know the 14 15 answers before you even get the test results. So I have to go off to the American 16 17 Legion. I'm the chaplain. So I've got to go. So 18 that's my statement. Thank you. 19 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you. 20 Mr. Mark DeCapua. Did I get that 21 right? 22 MARK DeCAPUA: Close enough. Mark 23 DeCapua. Last name is D-E-C-A-P-U-A. I live at 24 485 Hopewell Road in South Glastonbury, right

across from Cotton Hollow Preserve, and I've been

there for 23 years.

I have no cell phone service. If anything happens to my family and there's no landline, I'm at a disadvantage for anybody coming to help us out. I also have strangers coming from Cotton Hollow Preserve and the Grange pool, which does not have cell phone service, coming to my house asking to use my landline to assist them, whether they need rides or they're injured. We've had car accidents in front of the house. We've had to assist with our landline phone because the people getting hurt couldn't use their cell phones.

And with the way the drainage is on that road with the black ice, especially this weekend, my biggest fear is for the safety of the public that if anything happens through that area, God forbid a school bus crashed, for instance, and there's nobody around, emergency vehicles will not be able to get there because no one knows that situation happened.

So, again, I'm in favor of it. And I think for the public that uses the Grange pool and Cotton Hollow Preserve, that area needs this cell phone tower. Thank you.

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you. Did anybody else sign up? I guess it's 2 relatively few. Would anybody like to make a 3 comment before I close the hearing? 4 5 (No response.) THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. So we'll now 6 7 close the public comment session of the hearing. I'd like to announce that we will 8 9 continue the evidentiary portion of the hearing in 10 New Britain on Thursday, February 8, 2018, at 1 p.m. Certainly, all who want to can come, and 11 12 there will, again, be transcripts. 13 Please note that anyone who has not become a party but who wishes to make his or her 14 15 views known to the Council may file written statements with the Council until the record 16 17 closes. 18 Copies of the transcript of this hearing, and the hearing earlier, as well as the 19 next one, will be filed with the Glastonbury Town 20 Clerk's Office. I hereby declare the hearing 21 22 adjourned, and thank you all for your 23 participation. And drive home safely. 24 (Whereupon, the above proceedings were
