1           THE CHAIRMAN: Good evening, ladies and  
2 gentlemen. I'd like to call to order this public  
3 hearing of the Connecticut Siting Council today,  
4 Tuesday, January 23, 2018, at approximately  
5 6:30 p.m.

6           My name is Robin Stein. I'm Chairman of  
7 the Connecticut siting Council. Other members of  
8 the Council present are Senator James Murphy, our  
9 Vice Chairman; Mr. Hannon, our designee from the  
10 Department of Energy and Environmental Protection;  
11 Mr. Levesque, designee from the Public Utilities  
12 Regulatory Authority; Mr. Silvestri; and Mr.  
13 Harder.

14           Members of the staff present are Melanie  
15 Bachman, our Executive Director Staff Attorney;  
16 and Michael Perrone, our citing analyst.

17           This is a continuation of a public  
18 hearing that began at 3 p.m. this afternoon.  
19 Copies of the hearing program and citizen's guide  
20 to Siting Council procedures are near the door for  
21 members of the public.

22           This hearing is held pursuant to the  
23 provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General  
24 Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative  
25 Procedure Act upon an application from Tarpon

1 Towers II, LLC, and Cellco Partnership d/b/a  
2 Verizon Wireless for a certificate of  
3 environmental compatibility and public need for  
4 the construction, maintenance and operation of a  
5 telecommunications facility located at 380 Horace  
6 Street in Bridgeport, Connecticut. The  
7 application was received by the Council on  
8 September 25, 2017.

9 This application is also governed by the  
10 Telecommunications Act of 1996 which is  
11 administered by the Federal Communications  
12 Commission. This act prohibits the Council from  
13 considering the health effects of radio frequency  
14 emissions on human health and wildlife to the  
15 extent that emissions from towers are within  
16 federal acceptable safe limit standards, which  
17 standard is also followed by the State Department  
18 of Public Health.

19 The federal act also prohibits the  
20 Council from discriminating among and between  
21 providers of functionally equivalent services.  
22 This means that if one carrier already provides  
23 service for an area other carriers have the right  
24 to compete and provide service in the same area.

25 The applicant published notice of the

1 filing of the application to the Council in the  
2 Connecticut Post on September 21st and  
3 September 22, 2017. The Council's legal notice of  
4 the date and time of the hearing was published in  
5 the Connecticut Post on November 20, 2017.

6 Upon this Council's request the  
7 applicant erected a sign at the proposed site so  
8 as to inform the public of the nature of  
9 the applicant, type of facility, hearing date,  
10 time and location, and contact information for the  
11 Council.

12 This afternoon members of the Council,  
13 staff and public personally conducted a field  
14 review of the proposed site in order to observe  
15 firsthand the potential effects of the proposal.

16 As you're aware, there is a sign-up  
17 sheet for those who wish to participate. A  
18 reminder to all off-the-record communication with  
19 a member of the Council or member of the Council  
20 staff upon the merits of the application is  
21 prohibited by law.

22 I wish to note for those who are here  
23 and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors  
24 who are unable to join us for the public comment  
25 session that you or they may send written

1 statements to the Council within 30 days of the  
2 date hereof, and such written statements will be  
3 given the same weight as if spoken at the hearing.

4 Please be advised that the Council  
5 cannot answer questions from the public about the  
6 proposal. A verbatim transcript will be made of  
7 this hearing and deposited at the Bridgeport City  
8 Clerk's office for the convenience of the public.

9 Okay. First, I would like to request  
10 the applicant to make a very brief presentation  
11 explaining where the facility is proposed, why  
12 it's necessary and what alternatives were  
13 investigated.

14 THE WITNESS (Roberts): Again, my name  
15 is Doug Roberts. I'm an architect with the Hudson  
16 Design Group. I'll just briefly walk through the  
17 plans.

18 This is our subject site --

19 THE CHAIRMAN: Excuse me. Can you make  
20 sure that that lady can see?

21 THE WITNESS (Roberts): I'm sorry. I  
22 thought I was moving it into the light. Please  
23 forgive me.

24 This is our subject site right here,  
25 which is 13 acres. It does have a building that

1 encumbers a fairly large portion of it. Our  
2 proposal is up at this corner here.

3 The site plan consists of a 60 by  
4 40-foot compound that we have located in this  
5 location here just off the pavement, and we are  
6 going to be looking to place a 90-foot monopole in  
7 that location with a compound for equipment and  
8 our backup generator.

9 We'll be running utilities underground  
10 from Rhodes Street all the way over to this site.  
11 And this is pretty much the layout for the tower  
12 as it stands on the top of the platform. The  
13 equipment is in this location. Transformer,  
14 electrical meter bank is in this location,  
15 underground utilities. And that's pretty much the  
16 development of the site.

17 One of the things we did talk about at  
18 the dinner break was possibly looking to -- if you  
19 go to C3, looking at placing along the west side  
20 some plantings along on that property line and  
21 that road. Something, you know, that would be  
22 kind of something that would be green all year  
23 long and will eventually grow up.

24 It's certainly not going to be able to  
25 hide a 90-foot monopole, but along that edge, the



1 foreground, the houses are not multiple stories.  
2 It will do a fair amount of screening for that.  
3 So that was one thing we did discuss.

4 THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Thank you.

5 Now we go to the sign-up sheet. Helen  
6 Olga Losak, if you can go up to the podium? If  
7 you could spell your last name to make sure we  
8 have it correctly.

9 HELEN OLGA LOSAK: Okay. Good evening,  
10 council. My name is Helen Olga Losak. My last  
11 name is spelled L-o-s-a-k. I am an elected member  
12 of the 138th District Democratic Town Committee.  
13 I represent all the neighborhoods surrounding  
14 380/400 Horace Street, the Germania Club.

15 We are opposed to the building of the  
16 cell tower on Horace Street. This is where the  
17 Germanian club is located. The club is a  
18 gathering place for many people and organizations.  
19 This location is highly residential with one, two  
20 and three-family homes. There are many businesses  
21 and restaurants on this upper part of East Main  
22 Street.

23 There also are two elementary schools,  
24 Beardsley School and Thomas Hooker School.  
25 Additionally several daycare and preschools and a

1 church are also situated here.

2 Cell towers are known to give off high  
3 frequencies and high concentrations of radiation  
4 linked to many kinds of cancers. The radius of  
5 this proposed cell tower's emissions would be  
6 widespread past Horace Street.

7 Several Midwest studies in America have  
8 reported a definite connection to cell tower  
9 radiation emissions affecting and causing cancers  
10 in adults and youngsters living near these cell  
11 towers. Wildlife, animals and pets have also  
12 developed cancers from cell tower radiation  
13 exposure. Studies from Spain, Denmark, the United  
14 Kingdom, Germany and Australia confirm high rates  
15 of various cancers in adults, youth and animals  
16 living near cell towers.

17 My district is comprised of many  
18 hard-working adults, school-aged children,  
19 elderly, the disabled and cancer survivors. We do  
20 not want this cell tower at Horace Street because  
21 of the great health risk of various cancers we the  
22 residents would be exposed to.

23 A better fit for this cell tower would  
24 be on the outskirts of the city of Bridgeport away  
25 from residential homes, churches, schools and

1 businesses.

2 And I thank you this evening for your  
3 understanding. This is for the public record and  
4 I'm going to turn in this signed letter.

5 Thank you.

6 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you.

7 I guess I can't really ask if anybody  
8 else wants to speak since there doesn't seem to be  
9 anybody else.

10 Before closing this hearing the  
11 Connecticut Siting Council announces that briefs  
12 and proposed findings of fact may be filed with  
13 the Council no later than February 22, 2018. A  
14 submission of briefs and proposed findings of fact  
15 are not required by this Council. Rather we leave  
16 it to the choice of the applicant.

17 Anyone who has not become a party, but  
18 who wishes to make his or her views known to the  
19 Council may file written statements with the  
20 Council within 30 days of the date hereof.

21 The Council will issue draft findings of  
22 fact and thereafter a party may identify errors or  
23 inconsistencies between the Council's draft  
24 findings of fact and the record.
