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THE CHAIRMAN: Good evening, ladies and gentlemen. I'd like to call to order this meeting of the Connecticut Siting Council today, Thursday, February 22, 2018, at approximately 6:30 p.m. My name is Robin Stein. I'm Chairman of the Connecticut Siting Council.

Other members of the Council present are Mr. Silvestri, Dr. Klemens, Mr. Edelson, and Mr. Lynch. Members of the staff present are Melanie Bachman, our executive director and staff attorney; and Robert Mercier, our siting analyst.

This is a continuation of a public hearing that began at 3 p.m. this afternoon. Copies of the hearing program and Council's Citizens Guide to Siting Council Procedures are available for members of the public. To my right in the back also a sign-up sheet is available there.

This hearing is held pursuant to the Provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act upon an application from SectorSite LLC and T-Mobile Northeast, LLC for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a

telecommunications facility located on town-owned
property behind the Southwest Fire Station located

3 at 2 Westwoods Drive in Farmington, Connecticut.

The application was received by the Council on December 22, 2017.

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This application is also governed by the Telecommunications Act of 1996, which is administered by the Federal Communications Commission. This Act prohibits the Council from considering the health effects of radio frequency emissions on human health and wildlife to the extent that emissions from towers are within the federal acceptable safe limit standard, which standard is also followed by the State Department of Public Health. The Federal Act also prohibits this Council from discriminating between and amongst providers of functionally equivalent services. This means that if one carrier already provides service for an area, other carriers have the right to compete and provide service in the same area.

The applicant published notice of the filing of the application to the Council in the Hartford Courant on December 20 and December 21, 2017. The Council's legal notice of the date and

time of this hearing was published in the Valley
Press on January 25, 2018. Upon this Council's
request, the applicant erected a sign at the
proposed site so as to inform the public of the
name of the applicant, type of facility, the
hearing date and location, and contact information
for the Council.

This afternoon members of the Council, staff and the public personally conducted a field review of the proposed site in order to observe firsthand the potential effects of the proposal.

This hearing tonight has been reserved for the public to make short statements into the record. These public statements are not subject to questions from the applicant or the Council, and members of the public making statements may not ask questions of the applicant or the Council. These statements will become part of the record for Council consideration. Again, there is a sign-up sheet near the door to my right.

As a reminder to all, off-the-record communication with a member of the Council or a member of the Council staff upon the merits of this application is prohibited by law.

I wish to note for those who are here,

and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors
who are unable to join us for the public comment
session that you or they may send written
statements to the Council within 30 days of the
date hereof, and such written statements will be
given the same weight as if spoken at the hearing.

We ask each person making a public statement in the proceeding to confine his or her statements to the subject matter before the Council. Please be advised that the Council cannot answer questions from the public at this time.

A verbatim transcript will be made of the hearing and deposited at the Farmington Town Clerk's Office for the convenience of the public.

Before calling on the members of the public, I'd request the applicant to make a very brief presentation describing the facility that is proposed.

DOUGLAS ROBERTS: Good evening. My name is Doug Roberts. I'm an architect at Hudson Design Group.

I'll briefly go over our site project with everyone. I'm hoping everyone from the public can see this. But basically we have a

- compound, 50 by 50 lease area. We're coming off
 the paved area that leads to the back of the fire
 department.
 - And our utilities are going to be underground from the utility pole on Westwoods

 Drive along this access right here.

The disturbance is approximately 3,600 square feet, which would consist of the driveway itself, the compound, and the utility run.

Our 48 by 48 foot compound has within it exterior equipment that is T-Mobile's with their back-up generator and propane tank, 130 foot flagpole, which all the antennas are placed within that flagpole. And that's pretty much it.

THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Thank you.

The first speaker -- and I'd ask when you come up to just spell your last name to be sure the stenographer has it.

And Rochelle Levins is the first and only.

21 ROCHELLE LEVINS: Hi, I'm Rochelle
22 Levins. I live on 88 Old Turnpike Road in
23 Bristol.

Part of our property is in Farmington in the back of our house, so we are on the golf

I have a huge concern about this. Mainly my two biggest concerns are health, which I am understanding that the Chairman did mention that you cannot address. But from everything that I'm reading, it could be, and it does, emit so many things that it affects our soft tissues consistently, and that there's no way around that. That's been proven. Many countries are looking elsewhere to do this. They've pulled the towers out.

And I'm just reading in your hearing notice. It says the purpose of the hearing is to hear evidence on the applicant's contentions that the public need for the facility outweighs any adverse environmental effects that would result from the construction, operation and maintenance of the property. To me that infers right there that there's an issue.

And, you know, I only ask the Committee would you want it in your backyard? We certainly don't. We do have the golf course lights already, so this is going to add more lighting.

And the second big issue that I have is we're retired now. Our properties are part of our savings, our estate. As you get older, we look to

- go into assisted living, or whatever you're going to plan, you know, your estate planning. And is it fair now that because the tower that today these gentlemen said was not even going to be optimal, is it fair that I'm going to lose maybe 50,000 or 100,000, or maybe not even going to be able to sell my property, a lovely home on the golf course that we've spent 52 years in? I just don't think that it is worth, you know, the trade-off. And I would like the Town of Farmington to reconsider that.
 - They have a lot of property down in the flats. Why not there? Tunxis Community College, my granddaughter just graduated from there two years ago. She didn't have any issues.

So thank you very much for listening.

THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you.

Is there anybody else from the public?

KEN JOHNSON: Good afternoon. My name
is Ken Johnson. I live at 2 Pine Hollow Road
directly across from the fire house. I'll be the
closest neighbor to this tower.

I have two young kids. And out of that whole piece of property over there, I'm surprised it's right out in the open, it can't be tucked in

1 the corner. Besides the health risks, I'm also 2 worried about my property. I mean, I've been 3 there 35 years, and some day I'll have to sell it 4 and retire. But how much am I going to lose from 5 property values from this 130 foot tower being 6 7 next to my house? 8 So I'd like you to really think hard 9 about it. Thank you. 10 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you. Anybody else? 11 12 (No response.) 13 THE CHAIRMAN: I'll close the public hearing portion. 14 15 The applicant had a homework 16 assignment, and they apparently were able to do it 17 without going home. So hopefully, Mr. Gustafson, 18 you can report back. 19 (Whereupon, Dean Gustafson, Douglas Roberts and Daniel Gechtman, having been 20 previously duly sworn, continued to testify on 21 22 their oaths as follows.) 23 THE WITNESS (Gustafson): I'd be happy to answer Dr. Klemens' question. With the 24

assistance from our legal team, I was able to

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- review the Farmington Valley Biodiversity Project

 Map, and the proposed tower facility is not

 located within a primary or a secondary

 conservation area.
- DR. KLEMENS: Thank you.
- 6 THE WITNESS (Gustafson): You're
- 7 welcome.

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- 8 MR. MERCIER: I just had one question 9 regarding the shared generator. It had to do with Interrogatory Response 34, and it basically said 10 you could install one. I just want to make a 11 clarification as to when that would happen. We'll 12 13 just say if the tower was approved and T-Mobile went on and they had their own unit, and then 14 15 later in time Cellco came out, would you 16 anticipate a shared generator at that point, or, since T-Mobile already installed theirs, that 17 18 therefore Cellco would also install their own rather than having a shared? Is timing key, I 19 20 guess is my question?
 - THE WITNESS (Gechtman): Yes. As you pointed out, currently T-Mobile is proposing a DC generator back-up propane on their further installation. So a shared generator would not be needed until we had more than one user of the

flagpole. So at the time where a second carrier
came on the tower, at that point we would look
into a shared generator at that point.

MR. MERCIER: Thank you.

MR. LYNCH: Just as a follow-up. If a second carrier did come on, and maybe even a third, but just a second for now, and they'd be able to possibly use the back-up generator, would that require a larger back-up tank, propane tank?

THE WITNESS (Roberts): Yes, it would.

Right now the DC generator that T-Mobile is proposing is basically going to handle their equipment. If we went to a larger generator set similar to, you know, some of the large sites we've done over the years, substantially bigger than that propane tank, huge.

MR. LYNCH: So that would mean the buffer around the tank would also expand?

THE WITNESS (Roberts): No, the 10 foot clear, until you reach a substantial amount -- I think it's 10,000 gallons -- then the buffer changes. But on most tanks it's the 10 foot clear from the spark. So if we had a 500 gallon propane tank, which is 400 gallons of fuel, we would still have that 10 foot.

MR. LYNCH: If it was a 500 gallon tank or 1,000 gallon tank, would that have to be fenced in on its own, or could it stand alone within your fenced-in area?

THE WITNESS (Roberts): It can stand alone within our fenced area.

MR. LYNCH: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Before closing the evidentiary record of this matter, the Connecticut Siting Council announces that briefs and proposed findings of fact may be filed with the Council no later than March 26, 2018. The submission of briefs or proposed findings of fact are not required, rather we leave it to the choice of the applicant.

Anyone who has not become a party, but who desires to make his or her views known to the Council, may file written statements with the Council within 30 days of the date hereof.

The Council will issue draft findings of fact, and thereafter the applicant may identify errors or inconsistencies between the Council's draft findings of fact and the record; however, no new information or no new evidence or argument or reply briefs will be considered without our

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permission.
