



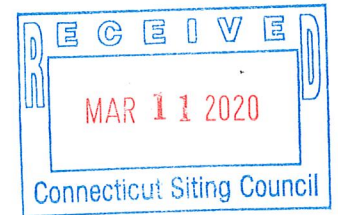

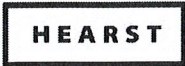

NOTICE

NOTICE IS HERBY GIVEN, pursuant to Section 16-50g et seq. of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended, and Section 16-50j-1 et seq. of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies, as amended, of the intent of Homeland Towers, LLC ("Homeland Towers") and New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC ("AT&T") (together the "Applicants") to file an Application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need with the Connecticut Siting Council ("Siting Council") on or after February 6, 2020 to construct a wireless telecommunications tower facility ("Facility") at 183 Soundview Lane in the Town of New Canaan.

The Facility is proposed on a 4.05-acre parcel of land owned by Keith S. and Marina O. Richey identified as Map 40, Block 105, Lot 74 on the Town of New Canaan Tax Map and includes an approximately 2,310 s.f. lease area in the northwestern section of the parcel.

The Facility consists of a new self-supporting monopole designed to resemble a pine tree ("monopine") that is 85' in height with faux branches extending an additional 5' above the top of the pole, bringing the total height to approximately 90'. The monopine tower will be located within a 1,763 square-foot fenced equipment compound at grade level. AT&T's antennas would be installed at a centerline height of 81' on the monopine tower and the Facility will be designed to support the antennas and equipment of other FCC licensed wireless carriers as well as local emergency communications equipment.

The Application explains the need, purpose and benefits of the Facility and also describes the environmental impacts of the proposed Facility.

A balloon, representative of the proposed height of the facility, will be flown at the proposed location on the first day of the Siting Council public hearing on the Application, or on such other day specified by the Siting Council at a time to be determined by the Siting Council, but anticipated to be between the hours of 12pm and 5pm. The Siting Council public hearing on the Application will be held in the Town of New Canaan.

Interested parties and residents of New Canaan, Connecticut are invited to review the Application during normal business hours after February 6, 2020 when the Application is anticipated to be filed, at the following offices:

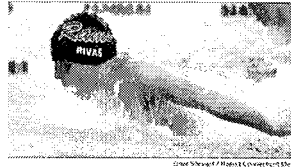

New Canaan swimmers defeat Fairfield

New Canaan won 11 of 22 events and rolled to a 20-7 victory over Fairfield in a boys swimming and diving meet Friday at the New Canaan YMCA. New Canaan was exceptional in the diving competition, as George Moore (1:59.34), James Ragusa (2:00.93), and Jackson Sampson (2:02.89) swept the top three spots. Diving coach Joe Sommi said it was the first time he had three divers score 200 or more points in a dual meet during the 25 years of coaching with the team. Gianfranco Pizzafati had a hand in four, taking first place in the 100 freestyle (1:41.80) and two backstroke (1:51.90) and swimming on the winning 200 medley (4:14.08) and 400 medley (9:33.48) relays. Patrick Colwell, a senior recipient, won the 100 freestyle. Colwell won second in the backstroke (2:13.20) and led off the winning 200 freestyle relay. Fairfield's victory came in the 200 freestyle relay, as Gordon Doherty, Jonathan Ryan, Ben Daldrup, CJ Ryan won first in 1:50.32.
