LAKE ROAD GENERATING COMPANY, L.P. RESPONSES TO NT-2010 INTERROGATORIES GENERATORS

1. If the facility has already been constructed, what versions of the NFPA standards were utilized?

The Lake Road Generating Facility ("Facility") design and construction utilized latest versions of NFPA standards published at the time of design (circa 1998).

2. If the facility has yet to be constructed, what versions of the NFPA standards will be utilized?

Facility construction was completed in 2002.

3. How would recommendation #6, "Recommendation as to adoption of codes" in the Thomas Commission Executive Report affect the facility?

This recommendation primarily requires compliance with the NFPA and ASME codes noted in interrogatory #4. See interrogatory #4 for the Facility's present state of compliance with these National Codes.

The second part of this recommendation is primarily concerned with the application of Connecticut Fire Codes, specifically the performance of flammable gas blows to clean piping. The Facility is well past the construction phase so there is no further need for "gas blows" to clean piping. The Facility does not intend to perform flammable gas blows to clean piping. This recommendation will have minimal impact on the Facility.

4. How would the following codes affect construction or modification of the facility:

As described above, the facility is constructed and no modifications are planned, however, the responses provided below describe the current status of compliance with the stated codes and the changes that would be required if the codes were currently applicable to existing operations.

a. NFPA 37 (2010 edition);

Standard for the Installation and use of Stationary Combustion Engines and Gas Turbines: The Facility fully complies with this standard. Upgrades were completed in June 2010 to the site fire detection and protection systems that brought the Facility into compliance with the latest edition of this standard (2010).

b. NFPA 54 (2009 edition);

National Fuel Gas Code. This code is primarily concentrated on conformance in residential and commercial applications. Of the portions of the NFPA 54 (2009) code that can be applied to the Facility, the Facility is in full compliance with the requirements of NFPA 54.

c. NFPA 54 Temporary Interim Amendment 09-3 (August 25, 2010);

National Fuel Gas Code Tentative Interim Amendment: The Facility presently complies with this amendment except for the methods of gas measurement. The Facility presently utilizes LEL% metering to detect gas levels. To fully comply with this amendment, the Facility will need to procure a gas gravitometer for gas percentage measurements. The Facility intends to procure a gas gravitometer by the end of 2010.

d. NFPA 850 (2010 edition);

Recommended Practice for Fire Protection for Electric Generating Plants and High Voltage Direct Current Converter Stations. The Facility is in compliance with NFPA 850 regarding Combustion Turbine Combined cycle Electric Generating Plants.

e. NFPA 853 (2010 edition);

Standard for the Installation of Stationary Fuel Cell Power Plants does not apply to the Facility and therefore will not impact the Facility.

f. ASME B31; and

ASME Code for Power Piping: Fuel Gas Piping system at the Facility was designed and constructed to ASME B31.1. Adoption of this code to apply to site gas piping will not affect the Facility.

g. ASME B31.1 Appendices IV and V.

Appendix IV: Corrosion Control for ASME B31.1 Power Piping Systems: The part of this Appendix covering buried piping applies to the short section of underground piping feeding the plant. The Facility utilizes a stainless steel pipe in this case that is electrically isolated from the main pipeline. Due to the grade of materials, further external piping corrosion controls are not necessary. Piping exposed to the atmosphere is protectively coated to prevent corrosion. Erosion / Corrosion is not a concern regarding internal wastage in fuel gas piping and thus is not addressed. Periodic piping wall wastage inspections are planned for the future to determine if other wastage mechanisms are occurring. The Facility complies with the requirements of this Appendix.

Appendix V: Recommended Practice for Operation,
Maintenance and Modification of Power Piping Systems: This
Appendix: This traditionally non-mandatory appendix
addresses operation, maintenance and modifications to piping
systems. At this time, although the Facility meets the intent of
this appendix, the O&M program recommended under this
appendix is not fully met by the Facility regarding the fuel gas
piping system. In other words, although the Facility currently
meets the spirit of this Appendix, the formal maintenance
program including records of maintenance and inspections
are not fully met. Formal records are kept and maintained for

repairs, system changes and maintenance. Periodic inspections are prompted through the Facility's Maintenance Management System. The Facility also has an emergency response plan to deal with emergencies, including piping failures. The Facility does not currently maintain a single file with all fuel gas piping documentation nor does it have a "Comprehensive Formal Program" of categorizing and maintaining all piping system information and documentation. The Facility has taken steps to further formalize the recurring inspection and maintenance program and assemble the appropriate documentation into a single program folder. Expected completion of this program to comply with this Appendix V is in the first quarter of 2011.

5. What is useful lifespan of the natural gas piping/pipelines located within and to the facility?

The Facility-related gas piping and pipelines are expected to maintain their requisite integrity well beyond the design life of the plant. (Typical Combined Cycle Economic Design Life is 30 Years).

6. Would the natural gas piping/pipelines within and to the facility need to be replaced during the life of the facility?

No.

7. Do you foresee any circumstances that would require replacement of a section of natural gas piping/pipeline within and to the facility?

The possibility of localized corrosion or the need to periodically perform minor piping modifications will require that short sections of piping be changed or replaced as necessary.

8. If so, would a new section of natural gas piping/pipeline within and to the facility be installed and require cleaning?

Replaced sections would be short runs, typically less than 20 to 40 feet in length. These sections will be thoroughly cleaned before installation to prevent the need for in-situ cleaning. There would be no need to perform a "gas blow" or other similar type operation.

9. What type of material is the natural gas piping/pipeline within and to the facility composed of?

All external Gas Turbine piping is constructed of carbon steel ASTM A-106 grade B and is constructed to Class 600 requirements (Except

for a short section of buried stainless steel supply piping). All Gas piping within the turbine enclosure and fuel module skid is constructed of stainless steel ASTM A-312 Grade 304 to class 600 requirements or greater.

10. How many linear feet of natural gas piping/pipeline are located within and to the facility?

The Facility has 161 feet of 14 inch main supply piping, 55 feet of this 14 inch piping is direct buried from the supplier to the Facility. The buried piping is stainless steel. All other facility piping is above ground. The 14 inch main supply breaks into 3 separate 8 inch piping legs supplying gas to each of the generating units. The total for 8 inch piping is 2095 feet. Each of the 8 inch unit supply pipes divide into two 6 inch pipes to supply different unit combustors. The total for 6 inch piping is 452 feet. Total length of fuel gas piping in the Facility is 2708 feet.

11. What is operating pressure (psig) of the natural gas piping/pipeline within and to the facility?

Pipeline Maximum Allowable Operating Pressure (MAOP) is 750 PSIG. Typical operating pressures vary from 490 PSIG to 680 PSIG.

12. What is the nominal pipe size in inches within and to the facility?

Main supply pipeline into the Facility is 14 inch pipe. Immediately after entering Facility fuel gas is conditioned and piping is reduced to three sets of 8 inch pipelines that each further divides into two 6 inch pipelines for servicing each of the three generating units.

13. What is the length in feet of piping/pipeline that requires/required purging within and to the facility?

All Facility fuel gas piping/pipeline is subject to purging operations if maintenance is necessary. Linear feet noted in Interrogatory 10. Piping and pipeline purging operations at the Facility always use inert gas (nitrogen) to displace the flammable gas.
