Since that time, this 8 Council has studied and reported on the utilities' 9 plans to adequately forecast and meet the public's 10 growing demand for electricity. The State of Connecticut and this agency understand that we 11 must meet the challenges of a restructured 12 13 electric industry to promote efficient and reliable electric generation and transmission, 14 15 keep costs as low as reasonably possible, and protect our environment. On that basis, we ask 16 for cooperation and innovation to identify changes 17 18 and refinements that will be necessary to make the siting process efficient, effective, and fair to 19 protect the citizens of Connecticut. 20 Any person, who desires to make their 21

views known to the Council, may file a written
 statement with the Council by September 9, 2016.
