Pursuant to and to the extent required by the Connecticut General Statute §16-50r, New Milford Landfill, LLC, (NML) previously Waste Management of Connecticut, Inc. hereby submits the following information requested for the New Milford Landfill:

- 1. A tabulation of estimated peak loads, resources and margins for each year. NML operates a Class I renewable energy source through the collection of landfill gas and combustion in two (2) reciprocating engines each with a generator rated at 820 kilowatts.
- 2. Data on energy use and peak loads for the five preceding calendar years.
