## TESTIMONY OF FIRST SELECTMAN RAYMOND G. BALDWIN

- Q. Please identify yourself.
- A. Raymond G. Baldwin, First Selectman of the Town of Trumbull.
- Q. How long have you held that position?
- A. Since December, 2001.
- Q. Are you familiar with the UI Application which is the subject of this proceeding?
  - A. Yes.
  - Q. Are you familiar with the area which will be impacted by the UI Application?
  - A. Yes.
  - Q. Does the Town support the Application?
- A. No. While the UI-proposed site would be the least expensive to construct the Town believes that the use of this site would have a substantial negative impact on the affected neighborhood. This is very much a residential area.
  - Q. Does the Town advocate another, alternate site for the substation?

- A. Yes. The Town advocates the use of an alternate site at Quarry Road which has been designated in Siting Council documents as Site #11. This site is in a non-residential area. As I understand it if the UI were to build its substation at the Quarry Road site it could establish the same benefit for the electrical delivery system without negatively impacting a residential neighborhood. I also understand that the Quarry Road site has no known environmental problems.
  - Q. Does the Town or the UI own the Quarry Road alternate site?
- A. No. That property is owned by the D'Addario family. The UI would need to acquire that site.
  - Q. Does this conclude your testimony?

A. Yes.
