The Department of Transportation (D.O.T.) has reviewed the above  
mentioned Docket and has the following comment.

This office has no objection to "Site 1" of the proposed  
project.

However, if the proposed project will result in work within the  
state highway right of way, United Illuminating Company must  
obtain an encroachment permit pursuant to the Regulations of  
Connecticut State Agencies, Sections 13b-17-1 and sequence,  
prior to performing any work within the state highway right of  
way. The District 3 Permit Office in New Haven will need to  
review seven complete sets of construction plans which shows all  
work within the highway right of way, all site work, and  
required easements and standard details for highway construction  
prior to issuing the encroachment permit.

The District Permit Office will determine the bond amount,  
insurance coverage, maintenance and protection of traffic,  
inspection, roadway restoration and pavement restoration  
requirements.
