Dear Mayor Mendenhall:

In connection with the cell phone tower proposed to be erected in the Holmberg orchards, I would like to suggest that the lights on the tower be red instead of white blinking strobe lights; the red lights are less obtrusive and red lights are permitted by the powers that be.

If you will recall a few years back a tower went up in Chesterfield(?), Oakdale(?) that had blinking strobe lights that aroused the ire of practically all of Southeastern Connecticut. The blinking white strobe lights could be seen right here in Gales Ferry and for miles in every direction. To make a long story short, the people rose up and protested and, I believe, even threatened a law suit. So instead of allowing the cell phone company to put up a tower illuminated with blinking white strobe lights, it would be prudent to be one step ahead of them and specify in the approval agreement that red lights be used.

If there are any questions, I suggest that someone look into the incident (brow ha ha) that took place on the other side of the river in Chesterfield(?), Oakdale(?), before Ledyard has its own brow ha ha. You know the old adage "an ounce of prevention."
