RE: **DOCKET NO. 327** - The Connecticut Light and Power Company application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a proposed substation located off Commerce Park Drive, Oxford, Connecticut.

I. Introduction

The application is from The Connecticut Light and Power Company (CL&P) for the construction, maintenance, and operation of an electrical substation in the Town of Oxford, Connecticut. The proposed substation would add capacity and improve electric distribution system reliability in response to increasing electrical demand in the Oxford area. The proposal is supported by the Town of Oxford.

CL&P proposes to construct a 115-kV to 13.8-kV substation on a 15.7-acre parcel owned by CL&P. The site is located in the Oxford Commerce Park which is presently under construction. The new development is generally located north of Jacks Hill Road, east of Christian Street, west of North Larkey Road, and south of the Larkin Bridle Trail. The proposed substation would be located off the newly constructed Commerce Park Drive.

The site is undeveloped, consisting of woodland and old field areas. An existing 115-kV transmission line corridor traverses the site in a north-south direction. The substation would be connected to the transmission line via an existing 4.4-acre transmission line easement north of the substation.

II. Technical

The application includes relevant maps, descriptions of the proposed site, costs, a description of the environmental effects of the proposed construction, and health and safety information. The application meets statutory technical requirements for processing the application. Council staff believes additional information can be obtained through pre-hearing interrogatories. This project would not require an outside consultant.

III. Administrative Review

CL&P stated that all service and filing requirements pursuant to General Statutes § 16-501 (b) have been fulfilled.

This application has triggered a Request for Proposal (RFP) to the Connecticut Energy Advisory Board (CEAB) pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes (CGS) Section 16a-7c. The RFP process allows for other entities to present alternatives to energy projects filed with the Council. This process allows the Council to simultaneously evaluate each energy application against potential alternatives. CEAB will issue a report to the Council April 13, 2007 that presents any alternative proposals for this application.

Pursuant to CGS § 16-50p, the Council shall render a decision within 180 days after the deadline for filing an application following the RFP process. The deadline for proposals to CEAB was February 27, 2007. The Council's proposed schedule assumes that no alternative proposals will be received by CEAB; therefore, the Council's deadline for a decision would be August 27, 2007.
