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MR. MORISSETTE: This remote public hearing is called to order this Thursday, February 17, 2022, at 6:30 p.m. My name is John Morissette, member and presiding officer of the Connecticut Siting Council. Other members of the Council are Kenneth Collette, designee for Commissioner Katie Dykes of the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection; Quat Nguyen, designee for Chairman Marissa Paslick Gillett of the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority; and we have Robert Silvestri; Louanne Cooley; Daniel P. Lynch, Jr.; and Mark Quinlan.

Members of the staff are Melanie Bachman, executive director and staff attorney; Michael Perrone, siting analyst; and Lisa Fontaine, fiscal administrative officer.

As everyone is aware, there is currently a statewide effort to prevent the spread of the Coronavirus. This is why the Council is holding this remote public hearing, and we ask for your patience. If you haven't done so already, I ask that everyone please mute their computer audio and telephones now.

This is a continuation of the remote public hearing that began at 2 p.m. this

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afternoon. A copy of the prepared agenda is available on the Council's webpage, along with the record of this matter, the public hearing notice, instructions for public access to this remote public hearing, and the Council's Citizens Guide to Siting Council Procedures.

This hearing is held pursuant to the provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act upon a request by New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC, also known as AT&T, to initiate a feasibility proceeding for the shared use of an existing tower located at 499 Mile Lane, Middletown, Connecticut. This request was received by the Council on December 14, 2021.

The purpose of this remote public hearing is to determine if AT&T's proposed shared use of the existing tower facility is technically, legally, environmentally and economically feasible and meets public safety concerns.

The Council's legal notice of the date and time of this remote public hearing was published in The New Haven Register on January 15, 2022. Upon this Council's request, the requesting entity erected a sign along Mile Lane at the

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entrance to the existing tower site so as to inform the public of the name of the requesting entity, the type of facility, the remote public hearing date, and contact information for the Council, including the website and phone number.

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This remote public comment session is reserved for members of the public who signed up in advance to make brief statements into the record. The deadline for the public to sign up to speak during this public comment session was Thursday, February 10, 2022. No member of the public signed up to speak, unfortunately. Please be advised that written comments may be submitted by any person within 30 days of this public hearing.

At this time, I would ask the requested entity to make a brief presentation to the public describing the proposed shared use of the existing tower facility. I understand Attorney Fisher is going to be providing that presentation.

MR. FISHER: Yes. Thank you,
Mr. Morissette.

MR. MORISSETTE: Thank you.

<sup>24</sup> MR. FISHER: I was advised, but maybe <sup>25</sup> wrongly by my own team, that you screen share, or should I screen share? I just want to make sure. MR. MORISSETTE: Attorney Bachman has

taken care of that for us. Thank you.

MR. FISHER: Great. Thank you. Very briefly, this project, as the Council and members of the public may be aware, is related to an application by New Cingular Wireless, AT&T, in order to share use of an existing facility site located in the City of Middletown. The property is at 499 Mile Lane Road, which is owned by the City of Middletown. It's about a 23-acre parcel. In some of the photographs -- this is one of the photographs -- is the location of the actual existing tower facility you see on the right of the photograph. To the left is the city's existing emergency communications facility. The property itself had historically been used by the US military and was previously part of what was called a Nike missile site.

20 In looking at the survey and other 21 materials, the existing tower location is 22 centrally located within the overall property. On 23 the survey itself there are various distances 24 shown and denoted showing the setbacks from 25 existing and adjacent property lines. And you

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also see some of the surrounding land uses which include single-family residential development and municipal properties used for schools.

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What's proposed by AT&T as part of Docket 506 and also at issue in this feasibility proceeding is to share the site as opposed to the actual tower itself. The proposal by AT&T is to construct a 150-foot monopole immediately adjacent to the compound and the existing lattice tower that the city owns. The existing compound that the city has already improved would be used by AT&T and future co-locators. The monopole itself would be built and constructed to accommodate the location.

As shown in the tower elevations, the existing tower is 180 feet in height and supports city-owned municipal whip antennas and microwave dishes for part of its Emergency Communications Network. And then shown in the elevation is the monopole by AT&T showing its equipment. Future collocators would be located at 10-foot intervals below what's shown at the 150-foot level.

We thank you very much for the
proceedings today and this evening, and that's our
presentation. Thank you.

1 MR. MORISSETTE: Thank you, Attorney Fisher.

Unfortunately, as I mentioned before, no members of the public have signed up to speak this evening so that will conclude our session for the evening. But before closing the evidentiary record in this matter, the Connecticut Siting Council announces that briefs and proposed findings of fact may be filed with the Council by any party or intervenor no later than March 19, 2022. The submission of briefs or proposed findings of fact are not required by this Council; rather, we leave it to the choice of the parties and intervenors.

Anyone who has not become a party or intervenor but who desires to make his or her views known to the Council may file written statements with the Council within 30 days of the date hereof.

The Council will issue draft findings of fact, and thereafter parties and intervenors may identify errors or inconsistencies between the Council's draft findings of fact and the record; however, no new information, no new evidence, no argument and no reply briefs, without our

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1	permission, will be considered by the Council.
