SUPPLEMENTAL SUBMISSION

This supplemental submission contains information and materials responsive to various requests made by members of the Siting Council and Town of Greenwich representatives at a November 2, 2011 site visit in furtherance of AT&T's Petition No. 1010:

1) Collocation

Attached in Exhibit 1 is a revised water tank/communications tower elevation as prepared by CHA and revised through November 8, 2011 which identifies space within the proposed 17'6" tower structure for potential collocation by an additional carrier.

At the Council's request, AT&T and CHA also evaluated an alternative which would involve a 27'6" extension on top of the water tank (10' additional height). It was determined that the taller structure would at a minimum have to be reduced to 10' in diameter to meet overturning standards, require significantly more structural steel and that additional structural testing of the water tank walls would be required to assess the viability of such an alternative. The alternative would also limit the number of AT&T antennas that could be installed inside the new structure and also be subject to further review by Aquarion and other agencies.

Based on the foregoing, AT&T requests that the Council rule on the Petition as submitted in its original configuration with the added collocation opportunity as shown in Exhibit 1.

2) White Pine Trees Adjacent to the Water Tank
Attached in Exhibit 2 is a report by Matthew Davison, a certified forester with VHB, who was present at the site visit. In it he describes the white pines adjacent to the water tank

and notes that one in particular is a hazard. As these trees are owned and controlled by Aquarion, AT&T has shared this information with it and a recommendation that the one tree in question be removed. The report also references a general maintenance standard that may be utilized in an effort to maintain the remaining two trees.

3) <u>State Historic Preservation Office Review</u>
Attached in Exhibit 3 is correspondence stamped by SHPO on October 19, 2011 noting

that the AT&T project has no adverse historic effects.

4) Notice to Abutting Property Owners
Attached in Exhibit 4 is a copy of a sample notice letter sent to abutting property owners on November 10, 2011 and an affidavit of mailing.



Observations of three (3) eastern white pine trees (*Pinus strobus*) were made following a Connecticut Siting Council site walk conducted at the above-referenced site on November 2, 2011. These trees, which were likely planted, are located in close proximity to the existing water tank. Of note was the condition of the closest tree to the tank, which is shown in Photos 1 and 2, attached. In addition to being an eastern white pine, a species prone to breakage, this tree is also a "hazard tree". Hazardous trees are defined as trees having structural defects that may cause the tree or portions of the tree to fail resulting in property damage or personal injury. This tree's trunk exhibits poor form, notably a V-shaped crotch. An overgrown vertical seam was apparent beneath raised bark at the crotch. This point of structural weakness is prone to failure resulting from wind loading or excessive weight due to snow or ice.

Pruning or maintenance of these three trees may be evaluated as a means of promoting tree health and minimizing the potential for failure. Due to the location of structural weakness noted above, preventative measures undertaken on this particular tree may be ineffective. Maintenance activities, including pruning should be done in accordance with proper arboricultural practices and follow the guidelines established under ANSI A300 Standards.





We are writing to you at the request of the State of Connecticut Siting Council to notify you of the above referenced matter and a New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC ("AT&T") petition that is currently pending before the agency.

Our client AT&T has filed for approval to install a concealed structure on top of the existing water tank at the Aquarion water filtration plant located at 455 Valley Road in the Town of Greenwich. AT&T proposes to enclose wireless communications antennas and other equipment inside a cylindrical structure 15' in diameter extending approximately 17.5' above the top of the existing water tank to an overall height of 64' AGL to provide its services locally. The structure would be fully enclosed, painted to match the existing water tank and appear as part of the water tank itself as shown in the enclosed photo simulation. Additionally, a small AT&T equipment shed would be installed adjacent to the water tank with a brick like façade and pitched roof.


