1	Verbatim proceedings of a hearing
2	before the State of Connecticut Siting Council in the
3	matter of a petition by Somers Solar Center, LLC, held at
4	the Somers Town Hall, 600 Main Street, Somers,
5	Connecticut, on January 15, 2013 at 7:00 p.m. at which
6	time the parties were represented as hereinbefore set
7	forth
8

10	ACTING CHAIRMAN COLIN C. TAIT: Ladies and
11	gentlemen, I call this hearing to order this Tuesday,
12	January 15, 2013 at 7:00 p.m.
13	My name is Colin Tait, Vice Chairman of
14	the Connecticut Siting Council. Other members of the
15	Council are Robert Hannon, the designee for Commissioner
16	Dan Estey of the Department of Energy and Environmental
17	Protection; Philip T. Ashton; Barbara C. Bell; and Edward
18	Wilensky. Have I forgotten anybody? No? Okay.
19	Members of the staff here are Linda
20	Roberts, Executive Director; Melanie Bachman, the staff
21	attorney; and David Martin, the Siting Analyst. The
22	court reporter is Gail Gregoriades and audio technician
23	Aaron DeMarest.
2.4	This hearing is held pursuant to the

1	provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General
2	Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act
3	upon a Petition from Somers Solar Center, LLC for a
4	Declaratory Ruling that no certificate of environmental
5	compatibility and public need is required for the
6	construction and operation of a 5 megawatt AC solar
7	photovoltaic project located at 458 and 488 South Road,
8	Somers, Connecticut. This petition was received by the
9	Council on October 13 October 31, 2012.
10	This hearing session tonight has been
11	reserved first for the public to make short statements
12	into the record. These public statements are not subject
13	to cross-examination are not subject to questions from
14	the parties or the Council, and members of the public
15	making statements may not ask questions of the parties or
16	the Council. These statements will become part of the
17	record for Council consideration. A sign-up sheet is
18	available for those who wish to participate.
19	As a reminder to all, off-the-record
20	communications with a member of the Council or a member
21	of the staff of the Council upon the merits of this
22	application is strictly prohibited.
23	I also wish to note for those who are here
24	and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors who are

1	unable to join us for the public comment session, that
2	you or they may send written comments to the Council
3	within 30 days of the date hereof. And such written
4	statements will be given the same weight as if spoken at
5	this hearing.
6	If necessary, party and intervenor cross-
7	examination that began this afternoon held at 3:00
8	o'clock this afternoon, may continue after the public
9	session if time permits.
10	We ask each person making a public
11	statement in this proceeding to confine his or her
12	comments to the subject matter before the Council and to
13	avoid unreasonable repetition so that we may hear all of
14	the concerns you and your neighbors may have. Please be
15	advised that the Council cannot answer questions from the
16	public about the proposal.
17	A verbatim transcript will be made of the
18	hearing and deposited and will be deposited at the
19	Somers Town Clerk for the convenience of the public.
20	We will now call from the list is there
21	anybody on the list?
22	A VOICE: (Indiscernible)
23	ACTING CHAIRMAN TAIT: Nobody on the list,
24	okay. Going, going, gone. The Council will now close

1 the public hearing session and resume the evidentiary 2 session of this hearing that began this afternoon. 3 Miss Miranda, I believe you have another 4 exhibit? You've done your homework. Good girl. 5 MS. JOEY LEE MIRANDA: Thank you, Mr. Vice Chairman. As you recall, in the afternoon session we 6 7 were asked for additional information regarding the flood maps. We have now provided the Council with an original 8 9 and 20 copies of what has been marked as Exhibit 8. And 10 I'd like to have it marked for identification. 11 ACTING CHAIRMAN TAIT: So marked. 12 MS. MIRANDA: Thank you. 13 (Whereupon, Petitioner Exhibit No. 8 was 14 marked for identification purposes.) 15 MS. MIRANDA: Mr. Lussier, did you prepare 16 -- assist in the preparation or direct the preparation of 17 what's now been marked as Exhibit 8? 18 MR. DONALD LUSSIER: I did. 19 MS. MIRANDA: Do you have any corrections, 20 modifications, or amendments to Exhibit 8? 21 MR. LUSSIER: No. 22 MS. MIRANDA: Is it true and accurate to 23 the best of your knowledge?

MR. LUSSIER: Yes.

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HEARING RE: SOMERS SOLAR CENTER, LLC JANUARY 15, 2013 (7:00 PM)

1	MS. MIRANDA: We hereby move it as a full
2	exhibit.
3	ACTING CHAIRMAN TAIT: Any objections?
4	It's now a full exhibit. I understand you have a few
5	questions?
6	MS. MIRANDA: Yes. We I guess first,
7	Dr. Bell, you had requested this, and did you have
8	questions for us perhaps?
9	DR. BARBARA C. BELL: I I just want to
10	say thank you, and it's completely responsive to my
11	question, and I appreciate the effort you took.
12	ACTING CHAIRMAN TAIT: Mr. Ashton has a
13	question one.
14	MR. PHILIP T. ASHTON: Just for the
15	record, the map shows an area designated as Zone A. That
16	would be the flooding limits for a hundred-year storm, is
17	that correct?
18	MR. LUSSIER: That's correct. Zone A
19	indicates the FEMA delineated 100-year floodplain.
20	MR. ASHTON: And there are four areas
21	marked Area A, B, C, and D on this, and surrounded by a
22	broken line, and that is the project area, is that
23	correct?

MR. LUSSIER: That's right, the -- the

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1	area labels are just indicated to show the four different
2	arrays that the project entails. The dash line indicates
3	the approximate project boundary.
4	MR. ASHTON: Nothing further.
5	ACTING CHAIRMAN TAIT: Anything further
6	from the Council? Are we ready for the closing
7	statement?
8	MR. ASHTON: You've got questions.
9	MS. MIRANDA: I have may I
10	ACTING CHAIRMAN TAIT: Yes
11	MS. MIRANDA: Mr. Vice Chairman?
12	ACTING CHAIRMAN TAIT: Yes.
13	MS. MIRANDA: Okay. Just a few questions
14	on redirect. Mr. Knox, you were asked I believe by Mr.
15	Ashton whether the switchgear would be exposed to the
16	public or if it would be encased. Can you elaborate on
17	your prior response with respect to that?
18	MR. RICHARD KNOX: Yeah, sure. So the
19	response to that will come from CL&P the treatment of
20	the switchgear facility out on South Road will be
21	dictated by CL&P. And to the extent possible, it will be
22	included in the D&M process as well.
23	MS. MIRANDA: Mr. Knox, it is feasible
24	however that CL&P will not have finished its

1	interconnection process by the time the D&M plan is
2	submitted, is that correct?
3	MR. KNOX: That's correct.
4	MS. MIRANDA: And if if that has not
5	occurred, we will not have the information available for
6	the Council at that time, correct?
7	MR. KNOX: That's correct.
8	MS. MIRANDA: Thank you. Mr. Lussier,
9	there were questions from Mr. Hannon regarding the
10	potential for invasive species to expand on the site.
11	And there were some questions that may have led to the
12	mis-belief that there was going to be grading occurring
13	at the site. Will there be grading done at the site?
14	MR. LUSSIER: No. I believe it was
15	Council Member Mr. Hannon mentioned the removal of six
16	to eight inches of topsoil. Just to be clear, the only
17	place that grading or earthwork of that nature will occur
18	is where the access road for maintenance is proposed.
19	There's no grading proposed across the site, you know,
20	beyond the limits of the proposed access road.
21	MS. MIRANDA: And the potential for
22	invasive species at the site are within the delineated
23	wetland on the site, is that correct, known as the
24	tributary of Abbey Brook?

1	MR. LUSSIER: Yeah, the the wetlands
2	report identified some species of invasive species or
3	organisms. The typically, you know, when you disturb
4	surfaces, you you present an opportunity for those
5	aggressive competing species, the invasives, to establish
6	a foothold. Since there's no grading proposed, you know,
7	on mass for this project, we don't think that there's a
8	big opportunity for invasives to become established
9	beyond the limits of where they are currently.
10	MS. MIRANDA: Thank you. And just one
11	last area of inquiry. Vice Chairman Tait raised the
12	questions about grassland bird habitats out at the site.
13	Mr. Teague, can we start with can you explain to the
14	Council why this site was selected with respect to
15	species, and in particular grassland birds?
16	MR. NELSON TEAGUE: Right. Among many
17	other factors that HelioSage, the developer of solar
18	projects, looks at is we try to identify sites that have
19	been previously disturbed, therefore minimizing any
20	impact to existing habitat or wildlife or any other
21	species. And one of the one of the primary reasons of
22	the 20 sites we looked at in the State of Connecticut
23	that this site was particularly attractive is the fact
24	that it had been used for an agricultural purpose for so

1 many years and it also had been mined at a point in time 2 that there was a significant amount of disturbance that 3 had already taken place, so the likelihood of disturbing any habitat was remote because of the activity that had 5 historically taken place on the land. 6 MS. MIRANDA: Mr. Knox, if through an 7 inquiry with the DEEP it were determined that there may 8 be an opportunity to provide for additional opportunities 9 to enhance grassland bird habitats, would that impact the 10 project? And if so, how so? 11 MR. KNOX: So there's -- there's a schedule consideration and then there's consideration of 12 the operation -- the long-term operation of the 13 14 maintenance of the project. In terms of the -- in terms 15 of the project schedule, we'd like to move into final 16 design as quickly as possible. And to enter into an 17 informal consultation process with DEEP related to the 18 establishment of grassland bird areas on the site 19 somewhat complicates a final design process and could 20 potentially add time to the schedule. And because we are 21 trying to have the project constructed by the end of the 22 year before the wintertime and operating, time is of the 23 essence to occur.

Additionally, in the operation and

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maintenance considerations, we feel that allowing grass 1 2 to grow would potentially cause a fire hazard on the 3 site. And additional factors include the defecation of birds on to the solar panels and increasing cleaning of 5 the panels themselves. 6 COURT REPORTER: One moment please. 7 (pause - tape change) 8 MS. MIRANDA: Thank you. And finally, Mr. 9 Lapinski, if -- if these additional habitats were 10 encouraged on the site and created, what would happen at 11 the end potentially when the facility is decommissioned? 12 MR. CRAIG LAPINSKI: The plan all along 13 was to do the least amount of intrusive activity, so when 14 the decommissioning does occur at some future date to be 15 determined, that the panels could be easily removed and 16 the possibility still exists that the land could be 17 returned to agricultural use. If bird habitats are 18 established over the site that are definitely defined 19 bird habitats, that may reduce the ability for that 20 particular area to return to agricultural use in the 21 future. 22 MS. MIRANDA: With that, if I could go to 23 the closing statement unless you have questions or the 24 members have questions?

1 ACTING CHAIRMAN TAIT: (Indiscernible) --2 MS. MIRANDA: Thank you. As the petition 3 and the exhibits and the testimony here establish, this facility is appropriate for approval from the Council by a Petition for Declaratory Ruling. It satisfies the DEP 5 6 -- the DEEP air and water quality standards and will not 7 have a substantial environmental effect. And therefore, we request that the Council give all the material due 8 9 consideration and issue an approval by -- excuse me --10 issue a declaratory ruling that no certificate is 11 required for the project. Thank you. 12 ACTING CHAIRMAN TAIT: Thank you, 13 counselor. 14 Before closing this hearing, the 15 Connecticut Siting Council announces that briefs and 16 proposed findings of fact may be filed with the Council 17 by any party or intervenor not later than February 14, 18 2013. The submission of proofs or proposed findings of 19 fact are not required by the Council, rather we leave it 20 to the choice of the parties and intervenors. 21 Anyone who has not become a party or intervenor, but desires to make his known views to the 22 23 Council, may file written statements with the Council within 30 days of the date hereof. 24

1	The Council will issue draft findings of	
2	fact. And thereafter, parties and intervenors may	
3	identify errors or inconsistencies between the Council's	
4	draft findings of fact and the record. However, no new	
5	information, no new choice no new evidence, no	
6	argument, and no reply briefs without our permission will	
7	be considered by the Council.	
8	Copies of the transcript of this hearing	
9	will be filed with the Somers Town Clerk's Office.	
10	I declare this hearing adjourned. Thank	
11	you for your participation. Drive safely.
