OBJECTION TO REQUEST FOR PARTY STATUS

The petitioner, BNE Energy Inc. ("BNE") respectfully submits this objection to a request for party status filed on January 6, 2011 by John Lamontagne, Cheryl Lamontagne, Thomas Satkunas and Eileen Satkunas (the "Requestors"). As discussed more fully below, in accordance with Connecticut General Statutes § 16-50n and the Council's past practice, the Requestors are more appropriately included in this proceeding as intervenors. In support of its objection, BNE states as follows:

- This petition for declaratory ruling was submitted to the Council on November 17, 2010 (the "Petition").
- 2. On or about January 6, 2011, the Requestors submitted a request for party status purportedly based on §§ 16-501, 16-50n, 22a-15 through 22a-20 and 4-177a.
- 3. Connecticut General Statutes § 16-50n (a) states that the parties to a declaratory ruling proceeding shall include: (1) the applicant, certificate holder or petitioner; (2) each person entitled to receive a copy of the application under § 16-50l if such person files a notice of intent to be a party; (3) any domestic or qualified nonprofit corporation or association formed in

- whole or in part to promote conservation or natural beauty; and (4) any such other persons as the council may at any time deem appropriate.
- 4. If unable to establish party status pursuant to 16-50n, the Council has the option of deeming interested persons intervenors pursuant to 16-50n (b).
- 5. The Requestors have not alleged any facts to support their request for party status pursuant to the criteria of 16-50n the Requestors do not allege (nor can they claim) that they were entitled to notice of the filing of this Petition nor do the Requestors allege to be a domestic or qualified nonprofit corporation.
- 6. In addition, the Requestors are not abutting property owners so, even if this were submitted as an application, the Requestors would not be entitled to party status pursuant to 16-50n.
- 7. Since the Requestors do not meet any of the above criteria, the request can only be considered through Connecticut General Statutes § 4-177a and R.C.S.A. § 16-50j-14, whereby a requesting party must establish "facts that demonstrate that the petitioner's legal rights, duties or privileges shall be specifically affected by the agency's decision in the contested case" and the manner in which the petitioner claims to be affected.
- 8. Based on the facts asserted in the Requestors request for party status, the Requestors are more appropriately included in this proceeding as intervenors and not as parties.

WHEREFORE, BNE respectfully objects to the Requestors' request for party status and requests that the Council grant intervenor status in this Petition.
