Dear Attorney Gaudet:

At a public meeting held on October 8, 1997, the Connecticut Siting Council (Council) acknowledged your notice to modify this existing telecommunications facility in Clinton, Connecticut, pursuant to Section 16-50j-73 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies.

The proposed modifications are to be implemented as specified here and in your notice dated September 29, 1997. The modifications are in compliance with the exception criteria in Section 16-50j-72 (b) of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies as changes to an existing facility site that would not increase tower height, extend the boundaries of the tower site, increase noise levels at the tower site boundary by six decibels, and increase the total radio frequency electromagnetic radiation power density measured at the tower site boundary to or above the standard adopted by the State Department of Environmental Protection pursuant to General Statutes § 22a-162. This facility has been carefully modeled to ensure that radio frequency emissions are conservatively below State and federal standards applicable to the frequency now used on this tower. Any additional change to this facility will require explicit notice to this agency pursuant to Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies Section 16-50j-73. Such notice shall include all relevant information regarding the proposed change with cumulative worst-case modeling of radio frequency exposure at the closest point of uncontrolled access to the tower base, consistent with Federal Communications Commission, Office of Engineering and Technology, Bulletin No. 65. Any deviation from this format may result in the Council implementing enforcement proceedings pursuant to General Statutes § 16-50u including, without limitation, imposition of expenses resulting from such failure and of civil penalties in an amount not less than one thousand dollars per day for each day of construction or operation in material violation.

Dear Mr. Rinebold:

Bell Atlantic Mobile ("BAM" or the "Company") plans to allow Sprint Spectrum L.P. ("Sprint") to install antennas and related equipment at the existing BAM facility in Clinton, Connecticut. Please accept this letter as notification, pursuant to R.C.S.A. § 16-50j-73, of construction which constitutes an exempt modification pursuant to R.C.S.A. § 16-50j-72(b). In compliance with R.C.S.A. § 16-50j-73, a copy of this letter is being sent to the First Selectman of Clinton.

The existing facility consists of a 210' lattice tower and an equipment building located off of Cow Hill Road in Clinton. This facility was approved by the Connecticut Siting Council in its May 5, 1992 Decision and Order in Docket No. 148.

Sprint will attach to the tower nine panel antennas, Decibel Model DB980H90, approximately 5' in length, and one small related Global Positioning Satellite System ("GPS") receive-only antenna; and install up to six equipment cabinets on the existing tower foundation pad. In addition, BAM will mount a small GPS receive-only antenna on the tower.

The additions of Sprint's antennas and equipment and BAM's GPS antenna to the tower site do not constitute a modification as defined in C.G.S. § 16-50i(d) because the general physical characteristics of the facility will not be significantly changed or altered. Rather, the planned changes to the facility fall squarely within those activities explicitly provided for in R.C.S.A. § 16-50j-72(b).

First, the height of the tower will be unaffected. Sprint's nine panel type antennas will be installed with the center of radiation at approximately the 196' level of the tower, and each antenna extending up and down approximately 2 1/2 feet from its center of radiation. Sprint's GPS antenna will be mounted at approximately the 50' level of the tower and BAM's GPS

antenna will be mounted at approximately the 60' level of the tower. In order to accommodate Sprint's antennas, three of BAM's existing antennas will be moved from approximately the 201' level to approximately the 206' level with BAM's nine other antennas. Thus, the additional antennas will not extend the current total structure height.

Second, the proposed addition will not extend the site boundaries. The proposed equipment cabinets will be placed within a 9' x 15' area on the tower foundation pad which is within the existing fenced area. The proposed change will have no effect on the site boundary.

Third, the proposed addition will not increase the noise levels at the existing facility by six decibels or more. The only incremental noise will occur during construction.

Fourth, operation of the additional antennas will not increase the total radio frequency electromagnetic radiation power density, measured at the tower base, to a level at or above the ANSI standard. A "worst-case" calculation for a point at the base of the tower for BAM's and Springwiche Cellular's existing operations indicates a power density of 6.11% of the FCC standard for uncontrolled environments at cellular frequencies of approximately 0.587 mW/cm². Sprint's operation would add 0.0126 mW/cm², or 1.26% of the FCC standard of 1.000 mW/cm². Thus, the calculated "worst-case" power density for the planned combined operation at the site is 7.37% of the FCC standard for uncontrolled environments as calculated for a mixed frequency site.

For the foregoing reasons, BAM respectfully submits that the proposed additions of antennas and equipment at the Clinton facility constitute an exempt modification under R.C.S.A. § 16-50j-72(b).

Cellco Partnership, d/b/a Bell Atlantic NYNEX Mobile (the "Company") plans to install an emergency generator and associated fuel tank at its existing facility in Clinton, Connecticut. Please accept this letter as notification, pursuant to R.C.S.A. § 16-50j-73, of construction which constitutes an exempt modification pursuant to R.C.S.A. § 16-50j-72(b). In compliance with R.C.S.A. § 16-50j-73, a copy of this letter is being sent to the chief elected official of Clinton.

The existing facility consists of a 210' lattice tower and an equipment building located off of Cow Hill Road in Clinton. This facility was approved by the Connecticut Siting Council in its May 5, 1992 Decision and Order in Docket No. 148. The Company plans to install a 50 kw propane-fired emergency generator within the equipment building and a related fuel tank on a concrete pad within the leased parcel. Copies of the site plan showing the changes are enclosed. The Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection Bureau of Air Management issued the required permit for the emergency generator on July 17, 1996.

The installation of the emergency generator and associated fuel tank at the site does not constitute a modification as defined in C.G.S. Section 16-50i(d) because the general physical characteristics of the facility will not be significantly changed or altered. Rather, the planned changes to the facility fall squarely within those activities explicitly provided for in R.C.S.A. Section 16-50j-72(b).

First, the height of the tower and the total radio frequency electromagnetic radiation power density at the site will be unaffected. The addition of the generator and fuel tank have no effect on either.

Second, the additions will be wholly within the existing leased parcel and will have no effect on the site boundary.

Third, the proposed change will not increase the noise level at the existing site by six decibels or more. The only noise will be during power outages and routine exercising of the generator for maintenance purposes.

Dear Mr. Rinebold:

Metro Mobile CTS of New London, Inc. and Metro Mobile CTS of Hartford, Inc., ("Metro Mobile" or the "Company") plans to add microwave antennas and transmitting equipment at its existing tower facilities in Killingworth, Haddam, Clinton and East Lyme, Connecticut. The addition of these antennas will enable the Company to establish a microwave-based connection between the cell sites and the Wallingford MTSO. Please accept this letter as notice of intent, pursuant to R.C.S.A. Section 16-50j-73, of construction which constitutes an exempt modification pursuant to R.C.S.A. Section 16-50j-72(b). In further compliance with R.C.S.A. Section 16-50j-73, a copy of this letter is being sent to the chief elected officials of the municipalities involved.

The existing facility in Killingworth is a 160' self-supporting lattice tower and equipment shelter and was approved by the Council on February 18, 1987 in Docket No. 69. The facility is owned by Metro Mobile and is located just south of Route 80 near the Deep River town line. Metro Mobile plans to add three six foot diameter, solid microwave dishes, one each, at the 85', 98', and 125' above ground levels (AGL). There will be no changes to the existing building.

The existing facility in Haddam consists of a 180' self-supporting lattice tower and equipment shelter and was approved by the Council on July 11, 1986 in Docket No. 58. The facility is owned by Metro Mobile and is located on Turkey Hill Road. Metro Mobile plans to add two six foot diameter, solid microwave dishes, one each, at 90' and 125' AGL. There will be no change to the existing equipment shelter.

The existing facility in Clinton consists of a 210' self-supporting lattice tower and equipment shelter and was approved by the Council on May 5, 1992 in Docket No. 148. The facility is owned by Metro Mobile and is located off Cow Hill Road in Clinton. The Company plans to add one six foot diameter, solid microwave dish at 130' AGL. There will be no changes to the existing building.

The existing facility in East Lyme consists of a 150' self-supporting lattice tower and equipment shelter and was approved by the Council on January 3, 1990 in Docket No. 116. The facility is owned by Metro Mobile and is located on Town property (also containing the Town landfill) off Roxbury Road in East Lyme. The Company plans to add one six foot diameter, solid microwave dish at 145' AGL. There will be no changes to the existing building.

The addition of Metro Mobile's microwave antennas and equipment at the sites does not constitute a modification as defined in C.G.S. Section 16-50i(d) because the general physical characteristics of the facilities will not be significantly changed or altered. Rather, the planned additions fall squarely within those activities explicitly provided for in R.C.S.A. Section 16-50j-72(b).

First, the height of the existing towers will be unaffected. All of the dishes are proposed to be mounted below the tops of the towers.

Second, the proposed additions will not extend the site boundaries. The microwave electronics will be installed in the existing structures at the sites. No strengthening of the towers is necessary to support the additional loading.


Third, the proposed additions will not increase the noise levels at the existing facilities by six decibels or more. The only noise associated with the operation of the sites will be from air conditioning and emergency power equipment, when in use, and will be comparable to what is at the sites today.

Fourth, operation of the proposed antennas will not increase the total radio frequency electromagnetic radiation power density, measured at the base of the towers, to a level at or above the ANSI standard. The standard for the proposed microwave frequencies to be used (approximately 6200 MHz) is 4.133 mw/cm². A conservative "worst-case" calculation for a point at the base of the tower indicates that the operation of the proposed microwave system will add no more than 0.00025 mw/cm² (0.006% of the standard) per microwave dish to any site. Since all sites are currently operating at levels well below the applicable standards, the addition of approximately 1/100th of one percent of the ANSI standard does not result in any measurable change at the sites and does not cause the site to exceed the standards as calculated for a mixed frequency site.

For the foregoing reasons, Metro Mobile respectfully submits that the planned additions of antennas and associated equipment at the Killingworth, Haddam, Clinton and East Lyme facilities constitute exempt modifications under R.C.S.A. Section 16-50j-72(b).
