This letter and attachments are submitted on behalf of Dish Wireless LLC. Dish Wireless LLC plans to install antennas and related equipment to the tower site located at 133 Coppermine Road, Oxford, Connecticut.

Dish Wireless LLC proposes to install three (3) 600/1900 MHz 5G antennas and six (6) RRUs, at the 115-foot level of the existing 178-foot tower, one (1) Fiber cable will also be installed. Dish Wireless LLC equipment cabinets will be placed within a 7' x 5' lease area within the fenced compound. Included are plans by B+T, dated January 26, 2023, Exhibit C. Also included is a structural analysis prepared by TES, stamped February 6, 2023, confirming that the existing tower is structurally capable of supporting the proposed equipment. Attached as Exhibit D. The facility was approved by the Town of Oxford, Approval No. #B01-309, dated November 13, 2001. Please see attached Exhibit A.

Please accept this letter as notification pursuant to Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies 16-50aa, of Dish Wireless LLC intent to share a telecommunications facility pursuant to R.C.S.A. 16-50j-88. In accordance with R.C.S.A., a copy of this letter is being sent to First Selectman George Temple and Steven Macary, Zoning Enforcement Officer for the Town of Oxford, as well as the tower owner and property owner.

The planned modifications of the facility fall squarely within those activities explicitly provided for in R.C.S.A. 16-50j-89.

- 1. The proposed modification will not result in an increase in the height of the existing structure. The top of the existing tower is 178-feet and the Dish Wireless LLC antennas will be located at a center line height of 115-feet.
- 2. The proposed modifications will not result in an increase of the site boundary as depicted on the attached site plan.



- 3. The proposed modifications will not increase noise levels at the facility by six decibels or more, or to levels that exceed local and state criteria. The incremental effect of the proposed changes will be negligent.
- 4. The operation of the proposed antennas will not increase radio frequency emissions at the facility to a level at or above the Federal Communications Commission safety standard. The combined site operations will result in a total power density of 8.98% as evidenced by Exhibit F.

Connecticut General Statutes 16-50aa indicates that the Council must approve the shared use of a telecommunications facility provided it finds the shared use is technically, legally, environmentally, and economically feasible and meets public safety concerns. As demonstrated in this letter, Dish Wireless LLC respectfully submits that the shared use of this facility satisfies these criteria.

A. Technical Feasibility. The existing monopole has been deemed structurally capable of supporting Dish Wireless LLC proposed loading. The structural analysis is included as Exhibit D.

- B. Legal Feasibility. As referenced above, C.G.S. 16-50aa has been authorized to issue orders approving the shared use of an existing tower such as this tower in Oxford. Under the authority granted to the Council, an order of the Council approving the requested shared use would permit Dish Wireless LLC to obtain a building permit for the proposed installation. Further, a Letter of Authorization is included as Exhibit G, authorizing Dish Wireless LLC to file this application for shared use.
- C. Environmental Feasibility. The proposed shared use of this facility would have a minimal environmental impact. The installation of Dish Wireless LLC equipment at the 115-foot level of the existing 178-foot tower would have an insignificant visual impact on the area around the tower. Dish Wireless LLC ground equipment would be installed within the existing facility compound. Dish Wireless LLC shared use would therefore not cause any significant alteration in the physical or environmental characteristics of the existing site. Additionally, as evidenced by Exhibit F, the proposed antennas would not increase radio frequency emissions to a level at or above the Federal Communications Commission safety standard.
- D. Economic Feasibility. Dish Wireless LLC will be entering into an agreement with the owner of this facility to mutually agreeable terms. As previously mentioned, the Letter of Authorization has been provided by the owner to assist Dish Wireless LLC with this tower sharing application.

E. Public Safety Concerns. As discussed above, the tower is structurally capable of supporting Dish Wireless LLC proposed loading. Dish Wireless LLC is not aware of any public safety concerns relative to the proposed sharing of the existing tower. Dish Wireless LLC intentions of providing new and improved wireless service through the shared use of this facility is expected to enhance the safety and welfare of local residents and individuals traveling through Oxford.

Dear Attorney Baldwin:

At a public meeting held on January 24, 2005, the Connecticut Siting Council (Council) acknowledged your notice to modify this existing telecommunications facility, pursuant to Section 16-50j-73 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies.

The proposed modifications are to be implemented as specified here and in your notice dated December 14, 2004, including the placement of all necessary equipment and shelters within the tower compound. The modifications are in compliance with the exception criteria in Section 16-50j-72 (b) of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies as changes to an existing facility site that would not increase tower height, extend the boundaries of the tower site, increase noise levels at the tower site boundary by six decibels, and increase the total radio frequencies electromagnetic radiation power density measured at the tower site boundary to or above the standard adopted by the State Department of Environmental Protection pursuant to General Statutes § 22a-162. This facility has also been carefully modeled to ensure that radio frequency emissions are conservatively below State and federal standards applicable to the frequencies now used on this tower.

This decision is under the exclusive jurisdiction of the Council. Any additional change to this facility will require explicit notice to this agency pursuant to Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies Section 16-50j-73. Such notice shall include all relevant information regarding the proposed change with cumulative worstcase modeling of radio frequency exposure at the closest point of uncontrolled access to the tower base, consistent with Federal Communications Commission, Office of Engineering and Technology, Bulletin 65: Any deviation from this format may result in the Council implementing enforcement proceedings pursuant to General Statutes § 16-50u including, without limitation, imposition of expenses resulting from such failure and of civil penalties in an amount not less than one thousand dollars per day for each day of construction or operation in material violation.







UTILITY ROUTE PLAN








TYPICAL EQUIPMENT GROUNDING PLAN

## **Service Load Condition (Rigidity):**

Operational characteristics of the tower are found to be within the limits prescribed by TIA-222 for the installed antennas. The maximum twist/sway at the elevation of the proposed equipment is 1.9964 degrees under the operational wind speed as specified in the Analysis Criteria.

# **Conclusions**







#### 1) INTRODUCTION

The appurtenance mount consists of Commscope platform mount, Part# MC-PK8-DSH at 115 ft., attached to monopole at Coppermine Rd., Oxford, CT, 06478, New Haven County. The proposed antenna loading information was obtained from SBA Network Services, LLC. All information provided to us was assumed accurate and complete.

#### 2) ANALYSIS CRITERIA

The structural analysis was performed for this mount in accordance with the ANSI/TIA-222-H-2017 Structural Standard for Antenna Supporting Structures and Antennas and Small Wind Turbine Support Structures using a 3-second gust wind speed of 117 mph with no ice and 50 mph with 1 inch escalated ice thickness. Exposure Category C & Topographic Category 1 and Risk Category II were used in this analysis. In addition, the platform mount has been analyzed for various live loading conditions consisting of a 250-lb man live load applied individually at the midpoint and cantilevered ends of horizontal members as well as a 500-pound man live load applied individually at mount pipe locations using a 3-second gust of 30 mph. The mount was analyzed under 30° increments in the wind direction. The analyzed loading is detailed in Table 1.

#### 3) ANALYSIS PROCEDURE

#### 3.1) Analysis Method

RISA-3D (Version 19.0.4), a commercially available analysis software package, was used to create a three-dimensional model of the mount and calculate member stresses and deflections for various loading cases. Selected output from the analysis is included in Appendix A.

Manufacturers drawing were used to create the model.

#### 3.2) Assumptions

- 1. The mount was built in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications.
- 2. The mount has been maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications and is free of damage.
- 3. The configuration of antennas and other appurtenances are as specified in Table 1.
- 4. All mount components have been assumed to be in sufficient condition to carry their full design capacity for the analysis.
- 5. Mount areas and weights are determined from field measurements, standard material properties, and/or manufacturer product data.

- 6. Serviceability with respect to antenna twist, tilt, roll or lateral translation is not checked and is left to the carrier or tower owner to ensure conformance.
- 7. All prior structural modifications, if any are assumed to be correctly installed and fully effective.
- 8. All member connections are assumed to have been designed to meet or exceed the load carrying capacity of the connected member unless otherwise specified in this report.
- 9. The following material grades were assumed (Unless Noted Otherwise):

a) Connection Bolts : ASTM A325

b) Steel Pipe : ASTM A53 (GR. 35) c) HSS (Round) : ASTM 500 (GR. B-42) d) HSS (Rectangular) : ASTM 500 (GR. B-46) : ASTM A36 (GR. 36) e) Channel Steel Solid Rod : ASTM A36 (GR. 36) g) Steel Plate : ASTM A36 (GR. 36) h) Steel Angle : ASTM A36 (GR. 36) i) UNISTRUT : ASTM A570 (GR. 33)

Fox Hill Telecom, Inc ("Fox Hill") was directed to analyze the proposed radio installation for Dish Wireless, LLC (Dish) facility located at **133 Coppermine Road, Oxford, CT**, for the purpose of determining whether the emissions from the Proposed Dish radio and antenna installation located on this property are within specified federal limits.

All information used in this report was analyzed as a percentage of current Maximum Permissible Exposure (% MPE) as listed in the FCC OET Bulletin 65 Edition 97-01and ANSI/IEEE Std C95.1. The FCC regulates Maximum Permissible Exposure in units of microwatts per square centimeter ( $\mu$ W/cm2). The number of  $\mu$ W/cm² calculated at each sample point is called the power density. The exposure limit for power density varies depending upon the frequencies being utilized. Wireless Carriers and Paging Services use different frequency bands each with different exposure limits, therefore it is necessary to report results and limits in terms of percent MPE rather than power density.

All results were compared to the FCC (Federal Communications Commission) radio frequency exposure rules, 47 CFR 1.1307(b)(1) - (b)(3), to determine compliance with the Maximum Permissible Exposure (MPE) limits for General Population/Uncontrolled environments as defined below.

General population/uncontrolled exposure limits apply to situations in which the general population may be exposed or in which persons who are exposed as a consequence of their employment may not be made fully aware of the potential for exposure or cannot exercise control over their exposure. Therefore, members of the general population would always be considered under this category when exposure is not employment related, for example, in the case of a telecommunications tower that exposes persons in a nearby residential area.

Population exposure to radio frequencies is regulated and enforced in units of microwatts per square centimeter ( $\mu$ W/cm²). The general population exposure limit for the 600 MHz band is approximately 400  $\mu$ W/cm². The general population exposure limit for the 1900 MHz (PCS) and 2100 MHz (AWS / AWS-4) bands is 1000  $\mu$ W/cm². Because each carrier will be using different frequency bands, and each frequency band has different exposure limits, it is necessary to report percent of MPE rather than power density.



Occupational/controlled exposure limits apply to situations in which persons are exposed as a consequence of their employment and in which those persons who are exposed have been made fully aware of the potential for exposure and can exercise control over their exposure. Occupational/controlled exposure limits also apply where exposure is of a transient nature as a result of incidental passage through a location where exposure levels may be above general population/uncontrolled limits (see below), as long as the exposed person has been made fully aware of the potential for exposure and can exercise control over his or her exposure by leaving the area or by some other appropriate means.

Additional details can be found in FCC OET 65.



#### **CALCULATIONS**

Calculations were performed for the proposed upgrades to the Dish Wireless antenna facility located at **133 Coppermine Road, Oxford, CT**, using the equipment information listed below. All calculations were performed per the specifications under FCC OET 65 for far field modeling calculations.

In OET-65, plane wave power densities in the Far Field of an antenna are calculated by considering antenna gain and reflective waves that would contribute to exposure.

Since the radiation pattern of an antenna has developed in the **Far Field** region the power gain in specific directions needs to be considered in exposure predictions to yield an Effective Radiated Power (ERP) in each specific direction from the antenna. Also, since the vertical radiation pattern of the antenna is considered, the exposure calculations would most likely be reduced significantly at ground level, resulting in a more realistic estimate of the actual exposure levels. To determine a worst-case scenario at each point along the calculation radials, each point was calculated using the antenna gain value at each angle of incident and compared against the result using an isotropic radiator at the antenna height with the greater of the two used to yield the more pessimistic far field value for each point along the calculation radial.

Additionally, to model a truly "worst case" prediction of exposure levels at or near a surface, such as at ground-level or on a rooftop, reflection off the surface of antenna radiation power can be assumed, resulting in a potential 1.6 times increase in power density in calculating far field power density values.

With these factors Considered, the worst case **Far Field prediction model** utilized in this analysis is determined by the following equation:

Equation 9 per FCC OET65 for Far Field Modeling

$$S = \frac{33.4 \ ERP}{R^2}$$

 $S = Power Density (in \mu w/cm^2)$  ERP = Effective Radiated Power from antenna (watts)R = Distance from the antenna (meters)

Predicted far field power density values for all carriers identified in this report were calculated 6 feet above the ground level and are displayed as a percentage of the applicable FCC standards. All emissions values for other carriers were calculated using the same Far Field model outlined above, using industry standard radio configurations and frequency band selection based upon available licenses in this geographic area for emissions contribution estimates.



For each Dish sector the following channel counts, frequency bands and power levels were utilized as shown in *Table 1*:

The following **Dish** antennas listed in *Table 2* were used in the modeling for transmission in the 600 MHz (n71) frequency band and the 2100 MHz (AWS 4) frequency bands at 1995-2020 MHz (n70) and 2180-2200 MHz (n66). This is based on feedback from Dish regarding anticipated antenna selection. Maximum gain values for all antennas are listed in the Inventory and Power Data table below.

The anticipated composite emissions value for this site, assuming all carriers present, is **8.98** % of the allowable FCC established general population limit sampled at the ground level. This is based upon the far field calculations performed for all carriers identified in this report.

FCC guidelines state that if a site is found to be out of compliance (over allowable thresholds), that carriers over a 5% contribution to the composite value will require measures to bring the site into compliance. For this facility, the composite values calculated were well within the allowable 100% threshold standard per the federal government.
