Good Afternoon Jon,

If the requesting entity halts the project or decides not to proceed with the project within the one-year deadline, a letter should be filed with the Connecticut Siting Council (Council) stating that the modifications will not be completed. This e-mail has provided this information, and an additional letter is not necessary.

A new modification with a new filing fee must be submitted to the Council for processing when this exempt modification project is preparing for implementation.

If the one-year completion deadline had not expired, the other option would have been to follow the exempt modification decision letter condition #8), which states, that the applicant may file a request for an extension of time beyond the one year deadline provided that such request is submitted to the Council not less than 60 days prior to the expiration.
