Re: **SUB-PETITION NO. 1293-BPKP-01 (Brooklyn, Pomfret, Killingly, and Putnam)** Eversource Energy declaratory ruling that no Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need is required for all transmission facility asset condition maintenance improvements statewide to comply with the updated National Electrical Safety Code clearance requirements.

Dear Attorney Bachman:

On March 26, 2020, Eversource Energy (“Eversource”) received an acknowledgement from the Connecticut Siting Council (“Council”) of Eversource’s notice to replace 50 transmission structures at various locations along the Eversource transmission right-of-way in the Towns of Brooklyn, Pomfret, Killingly, and Putnam subject to conditions. On December 18, 2023, Eversource was granted a fourth extension from the Council to complete maintenance improvements associated with the structure replacement project by March 26, 2025. Among other conditions of the acknowledgement, the Council required that Eversource submit the following item:

- Not less than 45 days after completion of the transmission line maintenance activity, the Council shall be notified in writing that construction has been completed.

Construction was completed on July 8, 2024.

Additionally, a representative photograph of the completed modification(s) to the existing energy facility, is included as *Attachment A*.

Eversource will be providing one original and two hard copies of this notice in the mail for the Council’s records.
