Structure Locations: One Transmission Line Structure located in West Hartford, Connecticut

I. Introduction:

In accordance with Condition 1 of the March 30, 2017 ruling by the Connecticut Siting Council (the "Council") (as set forth in the Council's March 31, 2017 letter) regarding Petition No. 1293, The Connecticut Light and Power Company doing business as Eversource Energy ("Eversource") submits this Sub-Petition.

II. Description of Transmission Work Activities:

Eversource's 1726 Transmission Line Structure Replacement Project ("Project") is part of an ongoing maintenance program that evaluates the integrity of its utility structures and implements repair, upgrade or replacement in order to ensure the safe and reliable transmission of power to its customers. Due to asset condition, one structure on the 1726 Line requires replacement at a location just south of Albany Avenue (U.S. Route 44) in West Hartford. The 1726 Line, in its entirety, is a 115-kilovolt ("kV") line that extends from Farmington Substation in Farmington to North Bloomfield Substation in Bloomfield. The structure to be replaced is a wood H-frame structure that will require an increase in structure height to comply with current clearance requirements.

Eversource plans to conduct transmission structure replacement work to remediate damage caused by woodpecker activity. The following work ("Work Activities") will be performed:

 Replace one existing wood structure, Structure 8082, with a new weathering steel structure. The replacement structure will be of the same design as the corresponding existing structure.

III. No Substantial Adverse Environmental Effect:

Eversource respectfully submits that the proposed modifications would have no "substantial adverse environmental effect" pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. § 16-50k, based on the following factors:

- a) All Work Activities would take place within Eversource's existing right-of-way ("ROW"), utilizing an existing access road, (collectively the "Work Areas"). Portions of the existing access road may be improved, as necessary. Eversource can access the structure replacement location utilizing its existing rights.
- b) The Work Activities would not result in any impacts to wetlands or watercourses. Work would be conducted in accordance with Eversource's *Best Management Practices Manual for Massachusetts and Connecticut (Construction and Maintenance Environmental Requirements)*, September 2016 ("BMPs") to avoid impacts to the nearby watercourse.
- c) No vernal pools or vernal pool envelopes are located in proximity to the proposed Work Areas.
- d) Based on review of the Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection's ("CTDEEP") Natural Diversity Database ("NDDB"), no Work Areas are proposed within a NDDB buffered area and wetland jurisdictional area and/or CTDEEP owned/managed land. Therefore, the Work Areas would not be subject to an NDDB Review Request. Work would be conducted in accordance with Eversource's BMPs to avoid or minimize impact to terrestrial habitats that may support rare species. With these protective measures, no adverse impacts to state-listed rare species are anticipated.
- e) The Work Activities will not require any tree clearing. However, Eversource may need to undertake tree trimming and/or vegetation removal/mowing within the managed ROW for conductor clearance and/or to improve access to portions of the Work Areas.
- f) A Phase 1A assessment review of previously recorded cultural resources on file with the Connecticut State Historic Preservation Office conducted by Heritage Consultants, LLC ("Heritage") did not identify any National or State Register of Historic Places properties/districts or archeological sites within 500 feet of the Work Areas. Based on a review of historic maps, aerial photographs, available soil profiles and existing conditions, the proposed Work Areas were identified to possess no/low archaeological sensitivity; therefore, Heritage advised that no further examination is recommended.
- g) The Work Areas are within a Metropolitan District's Watershed. However, all Work Activities will be within Eversource's ROW and will be confined to the existing work pad and access road. No impacts to the watershed are anticipated as a result of the Work Activities.
- h) The replacement structure will increase in height by approximately 4.5 feet to comply with current clearance requirements.
- i) There are no 100-year flood zones in the Work Areas.
- j) No change in noise levels would result from the installation of the new structure and the applicable lines would continue to comply with the State of Connecticut noise regulations.
- k) Any changes in electric and magnetic field levels outside the ROW would be negligible.

IV. Mitigation:

Temporary environmental effects from construction will be mitigated as follows:

- Erosion and sediment controls ("E&S") will be employed and maintained, as needed, for the duration of the Work Activities in accordance with the 2002 Connecticut Guidelines for Soil Erosion and Sediment Control and the BMPs.
- Potential impacts to nearby water resources will be avoided using temporary construction matting and adherence to the BMPs.
- Eversource's contractor will perform construction sequencing such that any earth materials
 are exposed for a minimum amount of time before they are covered, seeded, or otherwise
 stabilized to prevent erosion.
- During construction, when necessary, anti-tracking mats would be installed at construction entrances to public roads to prevent tracking of soil onto local roads.
- Upon completion of the Work Activities, all disturbed/exposed areas will be stabilized and revegetated as needed. After establishing permanent ground cover, Eversource's contractor would remove the temporary E&S controls and remove/dispose of any accumulated sediments and debris from areas where such measures were used.

V. Access:

No new permanent access roads would be constructed to facilitate access to the structure, however, the existing access road may be hardened and widened at turning areas to facilitate the safe passage of construction vehicles.

Eversource will access the Work Areas by entering its ROW from an existing access point on Albany Avenue (US Route 44) in West Hartford.






