RE: **PETITION NO. 1350A** – EIP Investment LLC declaratory ruling, pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §4-176 and §16-50k, for the proposed construction, maintenance and operation of a 19.98-megawatt combined heat and power fuel cell facility and associated equipment to be located within Building 107 on the corner of Curtis Street and the Pan Am Southern, LLC railroad tracks at the Stanley Black & Decker Campus, 480 Myrtle Street, New Britain, Connecticut. **Reopening of this petition based on changed conditions pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §4-181a(b).**

During a public meeting of the Connecticut Siting Council (Council) held on September 9, 2021, the Council voted to grant EIP Investment LLC’s August 20, 2021 Motion to Reopen and Modify the Council’s October 26, 2018 declaratory ruling for the construction, maintenance and operation of the 19.98-megawatt combined heat and power fuel cell facility in New Britain based on changed conditions, pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §4-181a(b). Pursuant to Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies §16-50j-40, the Connecticut Siting Council hereby solicits your written comments on the above-referenced reopened petition.
