We have met with the Citrine Power team to understand and review the proposed facilities and support their petition application.


The proposed solar facilities are set back from the road, are sited on industrially zoned property and make a productive use of otherwise unused property.

Further the Town of East Hampton and our schools will be the beneficiaries of the virtual net metering credits from the systems. East Hampton supports renewable energy and we are happy that our Town will host these solar facilities that will, if approved, contribute to the State's robust RPS standards.

The Towns Inland Wetlands Watercourses Agency and Planning & Zoning Commission have met to review the project and have made no suggestions for revision. Accordingly, we are in support of the solar facilities in general, pending Connecticut Siting Council's review and approval.
