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MR. SILVESTRI: This remote public comment session is called to order this Tuesday, March 2, 2021, at 6:30 p.m. My name is Robert Silvestri, member and presiding officer of the Connecticut Siting Council.

Other members of the Council are Mr. Robert Hannon, designee for Commissioner Katie Dykes of the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection, Mr. John Morissette, Mr. Michael Harder, Mr. Daniel P. Lynch, Jr., and Mr. Edward Edelson.

Members of the staff are Ms. Melanie Bachman, executive director and staff attorney; Ms. Christina Walsh, supervising siting analyst; and Ms. Lisa Fontaine, fiscal administrative officer.

As all are keenly aware, there is currently a statewide effort to prevent the spread of the Coronavirus. And this is why the Council is holding this remote public hearing, and we again ask for your patience.

If you haven't done so already, I ask that everyone please mute their computer audio and/or telephone at this time.

This is a continuation of a remote

public hearing that began at 2 p.m. this afternoon. A copy of the prepared agenda is available on the Council's Petition No. 1426 webpage, along with the record of this matter, the public hearing notice, instructions for public access to this remote public hearing, and the Council's Citizens Guide to Siting Council Procedures.

This hearing is held pursuant to the provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative

Procedure Act upon a petition from East Windsor Solar One, LLC for a declaratory ruling pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 4-176 and Section 16-50k for the proposed construction, maintenance and operation of a 4.9-megawatt AC solar photovoltaic electric generating facility located west of the Ellington town boundary at 341 East Road, East Windsor, Connecticut. The petition was received by the Council on August 10, 2020.

The Council's legal notice of the date and time of this remote public hearing was published in The Journal Inquirer on January 19, 2021. Upon this Council's request, the petitioner

erected a sign at the access road entrance along East Road so as to inform the public of the name of the petitioner, the type of facility, the remote public hearing date, and contact information for the Council.

Please be advised that the Council does not issue permits for stormwater management. If the proposed project is approved by the Council, a Department of Energy and Environmental Protection Stormwater Permit is independently required. The Department of Energy and Environmental Protection could hold a public hearing on any stormwater permit application.

Please also be advised that the Council's project evaluation criteria under the statute does not include consideration of property values.

This remote public comment session is reserved for members of the public who signed up in advance to make brief statements into the record. The deadline for the public to sign up to speak during this public comment session was Tuesday, February 23, 2021. No member of the public signed up to speak. Please be advised that written comments may be submitted by any person

within 30 days of this public hearing.

At this time, I request the petitioner to make a very brief presentation to the public for those who are listening and watching that describes the proposed facility.

And I believe, Mr. Fitzgerald, would you be doing that?

MR. FITZGERALD: Yes, Mr. Silvestri, I will be.

MR. SILVESTRI: Please proceed.

MR. FITZGERALD: Okay. Fantastic.

Good evening, Mr. Silvestri, and members of the
Siting Council and staff. My name is Bryan
Fitzgerald. I'm the director of development for
Verogy and East Windsor Solar One. Thank you for
having us this evening to discuss Petition 1426,
East Windsor Solar One. You also see on the
screen there that was just shared a site plan of
the proposed facility which is specifically sheet
OP-1.

Verogy is a Hartford, Connecticut based solar energy developer. Verogy develops, finances, installs and operates solar energy systems in the municipal, commercial and utility scale markets with a primary focus in New England

and mid Atlantic regions.

Petition No. 1426 is East Windsor Solar One and a 4.9 megawatt solar photovoltaic electric generating system located at 341 East Road in East Windsor, Connecticut. The proposed project would occupy approximately 29.1 acres of the 75.99 acre parcel located in East Windsor, Connecticut.

Access to the proposed project would originate from East Road approximately 500 feet south of the intersection of East and Middle Road.

The proposed project will feature a landscaping buffer of approximately 200 evergreen trees to be planted in between Middle Road and the project's northern fence line.

Additionally, this northern fence line has been designed to incorporate privacy slats and be 8 feet tall in height. The western fence line, or fence line between East Road and the project, will also include privacy slats for individual visual screening. Additional landscaping measures are being considered for the western fence line at this time as well.

East Windsor Solar One will consist of 19,344 solar modules to be mounted on a fixed tilt racking system. DC electricity from the solar

panels will be converted to AC electricity via string level inverters.

Renewable energy produced will be delivered to a 23 kilovolt distribution circuit that will be upgraded from single-phase to three-phase by East Windsor Solar One. 100 percent of the cost to upgrade the existing utility infrastructure will be borne by the project.

East Windsor Solar One anticipates electricity production to be approximately 9,362 megawatt hours per year. That's enough electricity to power about 1,154 average homes each year, and the project is expected to offset approximately 6,620 metric tons of carbon dioxide emissions annually.

Throughout the development of the project, the petitioner completed a comprehensive environmental assessment for the proposed project and development area. Specific studies included in this environmental assessment are wetland delineation and vernal pool studies, phase 1A and 1B cultural resources assessments, as well as a sign-off from the State Historic Preservation Office, the consultation and final determination

from the Connecticut DEEP Natural Diversity Data
Base Division, and an FAA no hazard determination
on the project. Additionally, the proposed
project would comply with the air and water
quality standards of the Connecticut DEEP.

The project received approvals from Connecticut DEEP and the Department of Agriculture as it relates to the petition's requirements.

Under Connecticut General Statute 16-50k the relevant agencies found no material impact to core forest or no material impact to prime farmland.

East Windsor Solar One will support the agricultural community through a livestock grazing program. The grazing program will include a sheep stocking rate of approximately three sheep per acre. The sheep will graze the interior of the array currently estimated at about 24 acres. The flock of sheep will keep the land in agricultural production while the array is operational and producing renewable energy. The grazing program will also be the primary source of vegetation management and help maintain the vegetation in and amongst the solar farm.

That concludes our overview of Petition No. 1426 and East Windsor Solar One. Thank you.

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Just a note on remote public hearings.

As many have come to realize, remote public

hearings are quite different from in-person public

hearings. For the latter, members of the public

ould sign in, step up to the podium and offer

their comments. For remote public hearings the

9 process is different in that the public is

required to sign up to speak prior to the

published deadline for doing so. And that's in

order to provide the Council staff with the time

necessary to facilitate connection provisions as

well as to institute procedures and precautions to

prevent interruption or call it "bombing," if you

will, of the proceedings. So there are protocols,

procedures and consistency measures that are

followed as part of the remote public hearing

19 process.

But again, while no member of the

21 public signed up to speak this evening, written

comments may be submitted within 30 days of this

public hearing. This leads us to closing.

Before closing the evidentiary record

of this matter, the Connecticut Siting Council

announces that briefs and proposed findings of fact may be filed with the Council by any party or intervenor no later than April 1, 2021.

The submission of briefs or proposed findings of fact are not required by this Council, rather we leave it to the choice of the parties and intervenors. Anyone who has not become a party or intervenor, but who desires to make his or her views known to the Council, may file written statements with the Council within 30 days of the date hereof.

The Council will issue draft findings of fact, and thereafter parties and intervenors may identify errors or inconsistencies between the Council's draft findings of fact and the record. However, no new information, no new evidence, no argument and no reply briefs without our permission will be considered by the Council.

Copies of the transcript of this hearing will be filed at the East Windsor and Ellington Town Clerk's Offices.
