The State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) has reviewed the archeological survey report prepared by Heritage Consultants, LLC (Heritage), dated August 2020. The proposed activities are under the jurisdiction of the Connecticut Siting Council and are subject to review by this office pursuant to the Connecticut Environmental Policy Act (CEPA). The proposed 17 structure replacements are associated with the Line 1208/1410/400 Structure Replacement Project. The submitted report is well-written, comprehensive, and meets the standards set forth in the *Environmental Review Primer for Connecticut's Archaeological Resources*.

No previously recorded archaeological sites are located within 500 feet of any of the line structures. Similarly, no properties listed or previously determined to be eligible for listing on either the State or National Register of Historic Places are located within 500 feet of any utility structures in the project area.

Phase IB of the reconnaissance survey consisted of subsurface testing of areas deemed to have moderate to high archaeological sensitivity, and that would be subject to ground disturbing impacts as part of the proposed undertaking. A total of 67 of 71 planned shovel tests were excavated successfully throughout the proposed work area; 4 unexcavated shovel tests fell within areas characterized by previous disturbance and/or steep slopes.

The reconnaissance survey identified 2 pieces of modern glass, 1 piece of plastic, and 1 modern U-bolt; no prehistoric or historic period cultural artifacts or features were identified during the survey.
