As everyone is aware, there is currently a statewide effort to prevent the spread of the Coronavirus. This is why the Council is holding this remote public hearing, and we ask for your patience. If you haven't done so already, I ask that everyone please mute their computer audio and telephones now.

This is a continuation of the remote public hearing that began at 2 p.m. this afternoon. A copy of the prepared agenda is available on the Council's Petition 1443A webpage, along with the record of this matter, the public hearing notice, instructions for public access to this remote public hearing, and the Citizens Guide to Siting Council Procedures.

This hearing is held pursuant to the provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative

Procedure Act upon a motion to reopen a petition from SR North Stonington, LLC for a declaratory ruling, pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes, Section 4-176 and Section 16-50k, for the proposed construction, maintenance and operation of a 9.9-megawatt AC solar photovoltaic electric generating facility on five parcels located north and south of Providence New London Turnpike, State Route 184, west of Boombridge Road and north of Interstate 95 in North Stonington, Connecticut, and its associated electrical interconnection.

On December 16, 2021, the Council, pursuant to a request filed by SR North Stonington, LLC and the provisions of Connecticut General Statutes, Section 4-181a(b), reopened the Council's September 14, 2021 decision not to issue a declaratory ruling in this matter.

The Council's legal notice of the date

and time of this remote public hearing was
published in the The Day on January 19, 2022.

Upon this Council's request, the petitioner
erected a sign near the proposed access road off
the southern side of Providence New London

Turnpike so as to inform the public of the name of
the petitioner, the type of facility, the remote
public hearing date, and contact information for
the Council, including website and phone number.

Please be advised that the Council does not issue permits for stormwater management. If the proposed project is approved by the Council, a Department of Environmental Protection Stormwater Permit is independently required. DEEP could hold a public hearing on any Stormwater Permit application.

Please also be advised that the Council's project evaluation criteria under the statute does not include the consideration of property values.

This remote public comment session is reserved for members of the public signed up in advance to make brief statements into the record. These public statements are not subject to questions from the parties or the Council, and

members of the public making statements may not ask questions of the parties or the Council. These public statements would become part of the record for Council consideration. Please be advised that written comments may be submitted by any person within 30 days of this public hearing.

As a reminder to all, off-the-record communication with a member of the Council or a member of the Council staff upon the merits of this petition is prohibited by law.

I wish to note that parties and intervenors, including their representatives and witnesses, are not allowed to participate in the public comment session. I also wish to note for those who are here and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors who are unable to join us for the public comment session that you or they may send written comments to the Council within 30 days of the date hereof and such written comments will be given the same weight as if spoken at the hearing.

Please be advised that any person may be removed from the remote public comment session at the discretion of the Council.

Please be advised that the Council

cannot answer questions from the public about the proposal.

A verbatim transcript of this remote public hearing will be posted on the Council's Petition No. 1443A webpage and deposited at the North Stonington Town Clerk's Office for the convenience of the public.

At this time, I request the petitioner to make a brief presentation to the public describing the proposed facility.

Ms. Weaver.

MS. WEAVER: Good evening. My name is Ali Weaver, and I'm the director of project development for Silicon Ranch for which North Stonington is a wholly-owned subsidiary of.

In December, SR North Stonington filed a motion to reopen our solar project by showing a number of changed conditions for the Siting Council's consideration. Based on and consistent with Council's deliberations on the project at the hearings that occurred in June and July of 2021, we made the following modifications which are, the layout is shown before you here as attachment A.

Most notably, we removed Array 1 and Array 2 on the north side of Providence New London

Turnpike, so the entire development now is south of State Route 184 there, Providence New London.

In the western array, which was previously referred to as Array 3, we relocated the access road in the western array from the eastern edge of the limits of disturbance to the center of the limits of disturbance, thus reducing the amount of access road length.

We've also reduced the laydown yard to just under half of an acre, and also added two rows of panels within the reduced laydown yard area to increase the distance from the property line to panels in the eastern array.

In addition, in the eastern array, increasing the distance of the panels, we've also shifted the limits of disturbance, the location of the security fence, and added a wooden fence to one of the abutters.

We've also adjusted the access road west of Wetland B to follow the existing access road there, and thus by shifting it further south of the property line.

Thank you for the opportunity to review the changes that have been made to this project layout.

1 MR. MORISSETTE: Thank you, Ms. Weaver. 2 Just a note on remote public hearings. 3 Remote public hearings are quite different from 4 in-person public hearings. For in-person public 5 hearings members of the public could sign up, sign 6 in, and go to the podium and offer their comments. 7 For remote public hearings the public is required 8 to sign up to speak in advance in order to provide 9 the Council staff with the time necessary to 10 facilitate connection precautions and to prevent 11 interruptions, or in common terms, bombings of the 12 proceedings. These are protocols, procedures and 13 consistency measures that are followed as part of 14 the remote public hearing process. 15 Again, written comments may be 16 submitted within 30 days of this public hearing. 17 We'll now call upon Catherine Maxwell to make a public statement. Catherine Maxwell, 18 19 please. 20 (No response.) 21 Unfortunately, I do MR. MORISSETTE: 22 not see Catherine Maxwell on the screen to provide 23 her statement. We'll give her a minute. 24 Catherine Maxwell? 25 (No response.)

MR. MORISSETTE: Unfortunately,

Catherine Maxwell is not with us to give a public statement, but she is allowed to provide written comments within 30 days of this public hearing.

If anyone on the Zoom hearing would pass that

along to her, we will certainly accept her written comments within 30 days of this public hearing.

We will now close the hearing. Before

closing this hearing, the Connecticut Siting
Council announces that briefs and proposed
findings of fact may be filed with the Council by
any party or intervenor no later than March 17,
2022. The submission of briefs or proposed
findings of fact are not required by this Council,
rather, we leave it to the choice of the parties
and intervenors.

Anyone who has not become a party or intervenor, but who desires to make his or her views known to the Council, may file written statements with the Council within 30 days of the date hereof.

The Council will issue draft findings of fact, and thereafter parties and intervenors may identify errors or inconsistencies between the Council's draft findings of fact and the record.

However, no new information, no new evidence, no arguments, and no reply briefs without permission will be considered by the Council. A copy of the transcript of this hearing will be filed at the North Stonington Town Clerk's Office. I hereby declare this hearing adjourned, and thank you everyone for your participation. Have a good evening. (Whereupon, the above proceedings concluded at 6:41 p.m.)
