Dear Ms. Bachman,

The Town of Lebanon Inland Wetlands Commission is contacting you in regards to the Petition 1566 during its comment period to address concerns by the CSC petition by CL&P/Eversource. The majority of this project lies within the Town of Lebanon.

Eversource, without question, needs to maintain their ROWs and has our support. That being said, we hope there is an adequate amount of oversight and accountability in the future. In the past, we and other residents have witnessed areas left with steep grade and erosion due to a lack of maintenance along this route. Proper remediation of these areas needs to be confirmation. It is encouraging that mechanical methods along with hand removal of vegetation is planned instead of the spraying of herbicides. Being an agricultural community, sensitive to the increasing environmental stresses on our ecosystems, the ROW corridors are becoming more and more important for many species of concern. It has been noted that these ROW have provided habitats for uncommon species of concern.

Pollinators and migratory birds are in decline in our state. Herbaceous shrubs along the ROW provide habitats for both these important biological entities. It seems the rotational period of mowing is not addressed but should be considered and noted. Eversource cites low impact methods in resource sensitive areas such as wetlands and vernal pools. These methods have not been identified in the Petition. It would be detrimental to their environment if a herbicide such as Roundup were to be used.

Thank you for your consideration in these matters. We all have a vested interest in making these ROW's in our state safe and more productive and not just a space to maintain.
