Re: PETITION NO. 1609 – TRITEC Americas, LLC notice of election to waive exclusion from Connecticut Siting Council jurisdiction, pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §16-50k(e), and petition for a declaratory ruling, pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §4-176 and §16-50k, for the proposed construction, maintenance and operation of a 0.999-megawatt AC solar photovoltaic electric generating facility located at 250 Carter Street, Manchester, Connecticut, and associated electrical interconnection.

Dear Executive Director Bachman and Members of the Siting Council:

I write to request a public hearing be held on the above referenced Petition and to make known my concerns with this project proposal.

I represent the residents of the 55th district, which includes part of the town of Bolton. This proposed project abuts the town of Bolton, and residents in my district are justified in their concern about a project of this scale being put in a rural, wooded, residential area. I think it is warranted to hold a public hearing on this petition to allow the residents of this area to publicly voice their concerns, and have their concerns heard.

While there is a push of late to install solar panels to assist with our energy production, I don't see the logic at all in cutting down a heavily wooded area for the installation of man-made solar panels. This will undoubtedly have an adverse effect on the natural habitat existing today. By clear-cutting an established wooded area, this project will have numerous effects upon the land, landscape, neighborhoods, wildlife and neighbors. There is good cause for concern over displaced wildlife,

including "species of special concern", effects to well-established hiking and nature trails, stormwater runoff, among others.

This site is also located within an easement for a gas line, and close to residential neighbors. If approved, post-construction, this site will have increased traffic and noise due to ongoing upkeep and maintenance of the solar operation. Therefore, the disturbance of the neighbors and wildlife will continue long after the initial construction is completed.

For these reasons, I submit my objection to this project on this site. If the goal of installing a solar operation of this magnitude is to protect the environment, then a project like this should be installed on an already disturbed parcel, on a building rooftop, or on/ around a large tract of asphalt. It makes no sense to me why it would be permitted to disturb and destroy a naturally occurring area under the guise of producing "green energy" through manmade solar panels.

I appreciate your consideration to my comments, and I look forward to further participation in the process.
