RE: Opposition to PETITION NO. 1627 - LSE Libra LLC (Lodestar Energy) petition for a

Hill Road, Hamden, Connecticut, and associated electrical interconnection

Dear Members of the Siting Council:

I urge you to deny PETITION NO. 1627 – LSE Libra LLC (Lodestar Energy). The 410 Denslow Hill Road property is not appropriate

for a solar farm for a variety of reasons.

Adjacent to the 410 Denslow Hill Rd. property is land owned by the State of Connecticut which includes

a FEMA flood plain and a dam that is scheduled for repair by the Department of Energy and Environmental

Protection (DEEP). The 10 acres of trees at 410 Denslow Hill Rd. currently absorb groundwater that

would flow to the lower elevation and into the flood plain and the dam which is in need of repair. The proposal to clear 8 of the 10

acres of trees will increase the water flowing into an already overloaded dam. The clearcutting and construction at 410 Denslow Hill Rd.

will cause traffic and other concerns for residents and unnecessary challenges for public safety and public works.

As you are aware, the Town of Hamden experienced tornados in 2018 and 2020; these events reduced the town's tree

Canopy significantly. In addition, the State of Connecticut had to clear trees to create an access roadway to service the adjacent dam

properties. The Town of Hamden has lost thousands of trees in the last 6 years and more loss should be avoided.

The Town of Hamden is dedicated to environmental sustainability and has been awarded

grants for energy efficiency improvements, stormwater management, and construction of the largest

municipally constructed rain garden. Hamden received its Silver Certification from SustainableCT this

year. The town is working to put solar photovoltaic installations on rooftops and parking lots. The town supports solar

in appropriate places but 410 Denslow Hill Rd. is not an appropriate place.
