The State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) has reviewed the referenced project regarding potential effects to historic properties. SHPO understands that the proposed project consists of the construction of four 250-KW fuel cell units in two phases with associated infrastructure components at the referenced address. The project will require approval from the Connecticut Siting Council and is therefore subject to review by this office.

There are no previously recorded archaeological sites or properties listed on the National Register of Historic Places located in the project area. Readily available historic aerial imagery indicates that the entire project area has experienced extensive prior disturbances. As a result, it is unlikely that significant intact archaeological resources will be impacted by the proposed actions. Based on the information provided to our office, it is SHPO's opinion that <u>no historic properties will be</u> affected by this undertaking.
