Dear Mr. Nicholson,

The State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) has reviewed the potential effects of the referenced project on historic properties. SHPO understands that the proposed project consists of the construction of a 1.99 MW AC solar photovoltaic facility. The project includes the construction of a gravel access road, metering equipment, and grid interconnection. The project will require approval from the Connecticut Siting Council. As a result, it is subject to review by this office pursuant to the Connecticut Environmental Policy Act.

No properties listed on the National Register of Historic Places have been reported within or adjacent to the Area of Potential Effects (APE) for this project. Six previously reported archeological sites are located within a mile of the proposed project parcel. Further, SHPO considers the area surrounding the APE to be archaeologically sensitive. However, a review of readily available historic aerial imagery indicates that the entirety of the APE has been previously disturbed by quarrying operations. As a result, the undertaking is unlikely to impact significant archeological deposits. Based on the information provided to our office, it is the opinion of SHPO that no historic properties will be affected by the construction of the proposed solar facility.
