RE: Petition No. 1668 – Johnson Controls Inc. petition for a declaratory ruling, pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §4-176 and §16-50k, for the proposed construction, maintenance and operation of a grid-side 3.9-megawatt fuel cell facility and associated equipment located at 35 North Main Street, Ansonia, Connecticut, and associated electrical interconnection. Request to Intervene

Dear Attorney Bachman:

Pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 4-177a and 16-50n, HyAxiom, Inc., (“HyAxiom”) hereby requests the Connecticut Siting Council (“Council” or “CSC”) grant HyAxiom intervenor status in the above-captioned proceeding.

As the Council is aware, in Petition No. 1595, the Council approved HyAxiom’s petition for a declaratory ruling for the proposed construction of a 4.14-megawatt fuel cell facility to be located at 35 North Main Street, Ansonia – the same address as the project site in Petition 1668.

In response to a question from the Connecticut Council on Environmental Quality (“CEQ”) as to whether the site identified in Petition No. 1668 as 25 North Main Street, Ansonia should be identified as 35 North Main Street, Johnson Controls, Inc. (“JCI”) responded, “[t]he HyAxiom fuel cell modules proposed in Petition 1595 were previously approved to be constructed at the same site as JCI’s Petition 1668.” In light of JCI’s petition for a project on the exact location as was approved by the Council in HyAxiom’s Petition 1668, the Council should grant HyAxiom’s request for intervenor status.

HyAxiom wishes to inform the Council that as the “Subscriber Organization” approved by the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority (“PURA”) to execute the Shared Clean Energy Facility (“SCEF”) at 35 North Main Street, HyAxiom is the sole entity that has the right to deploy HyAxiom fuel cells at the site. Moreover, the Tariff Term Agreement executed with The United Illuminating Company (“UI”) on June 7, 2023, is still in effect.

Finally, as the owner and developer of SCEF at 35 North Main Street, the City of Ansonia does not have the ability or power to decide which project will be deployed at the site as JCI has suggested in its June 3, 2025 letter to the Council. HyAxiom’s bid, which was awarded by UI and the Department of Energy and Environment Protection (“DEEP”) on April 21, 2023, was approved by PURA on June 7, 2023 and the project was subsequently approved by the Council on February 16, 2024. The Council’s approval included detailed information on how nine (9) 460 kW HyAxiom PureCell Model 400 fuel cells power modules will be providing up to 3.9 MW of electricity to UI from 35 North Main Street. Thus, JCI’s statement that due to the City of Ansonia’s decision to not use HyAxiom fuel cells culminated in the replacement of HyAxiom units misrepresents the City’s authority and is contrary to the statutory authority given to the Council and other agencies in selecting HyAxiom fuel cells as the appropriate SCEF technology to be deployed at 35 North Main Street.



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Finally, HyAxiom would like to emphasize that its position as the “Subscriber Organization” has not changed, and it will do everything in its power to develop the project approved by the Council in Petition 1595.
