The State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) has reviewed your request for information concerning the potential effects to historic properties associated with the referenced project. SHPO understands that the proposed project entails the construction of a 1.7 MW AC carport/canopy solar voltaic facility with associated equipment within the existing parking area at the referenced address. The project will require approval from the Connecticut Siting Council. As a result, it is subject to review by this office.

There are no properties listed on the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) within the Area of Potential Effect (APE) for the project. A single previously reported archaeological site has been recorded within a mile of the project parcel. SHPO considers areas around the APE to retain archaeological sensitivity. However, project plans indicate that the proposed activities will be confined to previously disturbed footprints. As a result, it is unlikely that significant archaeological resources will be impacted by the proposed actions. Therefore, based on the information provided to our office, it is SHPO's opinion that no historic properties will be affected by this undertaking.
