#### TESTIMONY OF DR. GARY JOHNSON

2	Magnetic Fields Associated with Low-Voltage Distribution Lines

### Q. What is the purpose of this testimony?

3

- 4 A. To respond to the Council's request for information concerning the levels of
  5 magnetic fields associated with utility distribution lines that provide electricity to
  6 local homes and businesses.
- Q. Are magnetic fields produced by both overhead and underground distribution lines?
- 9 A. Yes. Magnetic fields are produced by any conductor carrying electric currents.

  10 This includes the distribution lines along streets whether they are located above

  11 ground or underground. The ground does not shield magnetic fields, so even

2		magnetic field present.
3	Q.	What levels of magnetic fields are measured near distribution lines?
4	A.	The distribution lines along streets, sidewalks, and into our homes typically
5		produce magnetic fields in the range from less than a milligauss (mG) to more
6		than 20 mG.
7	Q.	What are the magnetic field levels measured near overhead distribution
8		lines?
9	A.	I reviewed magnetic field measurements that were taken near a random sample of
10		674 overhead distribution lines in a large nationwide survey. The peak levels
11		underneath these lines ranged from 0.1 mG to 19.3 mG, with an average of 1.5
12		mG.
13	Q.	What are the magnetic field levels measured near underground distribution
14		lines?
15	A.	The magnetic fields measured over a random sample of 227 underground
16		distribution lines in the same national survey were similar to those of overhead
17		distribution lines and ranged from 0.1 mG to 22.0 mG, with an average of 1.4
18		mG.
19	Q.	Are the measurements reported in this nationwide survey similar to what
20		you have measured near distribution lines in Connecticut?
21	A.	Yes, the measurements I summarized from the national survey are consistent with
22		the magnetic field levels I have measured in various locations in Connecticut. My
23		measurements along streets below overhead distribution lines have ranged from
24		less than one mG to over 11 mG. I have measured magnetic field values up to 18
25	None and a second	mG on sidewalks and along streets above underground distribution lines.

though we do not see underground power lines it does not mean that there is not a

- 1 Magnetic field levels along streets are commonly in the 2 to 4 mG range with
- 2 occasional 'spikes' to much higher levels.
