Mr. Ashton moved to approve the minutes of July 7, 2016, seconded by Mr. Murphy. The

motion passed with Dr. Klemens, Mr. Lynch, and Mr. Caron abstaining.

PETITION NO. 1218 – PSEG Power Connecticut LLC petition for a declaratory ruling that no Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need is required for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a new 485 megawatt (MW) dual fuel combinedcycle electric generating facility at the existing Bridgeport Harbor Station located at 1 Atlantic Street, Bridgeport, Connecticut. Draft Findings of Fact, Opinion, and Decision & Order.

Dr. Klemens moved to approve the Draft Findings of Fact, Opinion, and Decision & Order, as amended, seconded by Mr. Murphy. The motion passed with Mr. Ashton abstaining.

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PETITION NO. 1221 - Windham Solar LLC petition for a declaratory ruling that no Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need is required for the proposed construction, maintenance and operation of two 1.0 Megawatt and one 1.5 Megawatt Solar Photovoltaic Electric Generating facilities located at 91 Plainfield Pike Road, Plainfield, Connecticut. Decision.

Dr. Klemens moved to deny this petition, seconded by Mr. Lynch. The motion passed with Mr.

Caron abstaining.

PETITION NO. 1222 - Windham Solar LLC petition for a declaratory ruling that no Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need is required for the proposed construction, maintenance and operation of three 2.0 Megawatt and four 1.0 Megawatt Solar Photovoltaic Electric Generating facilities located southeast of Hartford Turnpike and south of Fisk Road, Hampton, Connecticut. Decision.

Mr. Hannon moved to approve this petition for 6 MW proposed in Projects 1-5 with the

conditions noted in the staff report and to deny the 2 MW Future Project, seconded by Dr. Klemens.

The motion passed with Mr. Caron abstaining.

PETITION NO. 1233 - Dominion Nuclear Connecticut, Inc. petition for a declaratory ruling that neither a new Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need (Certificate) nor a modification of the existing Certificate is required for the proposed construction, maintenance and operation of an on-site horizontal storage module fabrication area at the Millstone Power Station, Rope Ferry Road, Waterford, Connecticut. Decision.

Mr. Lynch moved to approve this petition, seconded by Mr. Murphy. The motion passed unanimously.

PETITION NO. 1234 - SolarCity Corporation petition for a declaratory ruling that no Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need is required for the proposed construction, maintenance and operation of a 2.8 Megawatt Solar Photovoltaic Electric Generating facility located at Becton, Dickinson & Company, 7 Grace Way, North Canaan, Connecticut. Decision.

Mr. Hannon moved to approve this petition with the conditions noted in the staff report and a condition that an anti-climb security fence be installed around the high voltage equipment, seconded by Dr. Klemens. The motion passed unanimously.

PETITION NO. 1235 – Doosan Fuel Cell America, Inc. petition for a declaratory ruling that no Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need is required for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a 440-kilowatt customer-side combined heat and power fuel cell facility to be located at Middletown High School, 200 La Rosa Lane, Middletown, Connecticut.
