The Connecticut Council on Developmental Disabilities grants federal funds to nonprofit, advocacy, and educational organizations to engage in advocacy, capacity building, and systemic change activities that contribute to a comprehensive, coordinated, and self-determined system of individualized services and supports that is centered on and directed by individuals with developmental disabilities and their families.

The Connecticut Council on Developmental Disabilities receives 100% of its funding from the U.S. Administration for Community Living with an annual grant totaling approximately \$736,000.
