

Connecticut Commission for Educational Technology March 2022 Executive Director's Report

Technology Planning and Sustainability

- Statewide cohort of K 12 districts to develop strategic technology plans using the Future Ready Schools (FRS) framework (<u>www.FutureReady.org</u>), customized for Connecticut schools and facilitated by FRS Director of Innovation Tom Murray
- Commitment by March 11, May kickoff, summer development and work sessions, and November convening
- Likely 2022 cohort size of 10 15 districts, with five enrolled already and interest in a 2023 cohort

Data Privacy Compliance

- Release February 22 of guidance at <u>www.bit.ly/CT-SDP</u> in the form of <u>frequently</u> <u>asked questions</u> and <u>presentation</u> to streamline compliance with Connecticut data privacy law for schools and educational technology providers
- Developed in consultation with the Office of the Attorney General and input from the State Department of Education
- Takeaways: Signing Commission's Data Privacy Pledge constitutes compliance, penalties for non-compliance, clarification of key statute terms, and application of state contracts (e.g., those covering researchIT services) for school use

Open Education Resources Pilots

- Outreach and guidance to support school districts and universities in summer curriculum development using authoring and collaboration tools offered through <u>www.GoOpenCT.org</u>
- Encourages collaboration within and across institutions, publication statewide for use of lessons, units, and courses in the fall of 2022

Remote Learning Standards

- <u>Standards for grades 9 12</u> provide guidance on educator and district responsibilities in the development of online learning pedagogy and supports
- Developed by the State Department of Education based on local and national benchmarks and with input from members of the <u>Remote Learning Commission</u>
- Part of Remote Learning Commission's charge (<u>PA 21-2</u>) to assess the impact of remote learning, develop standards, and provide recommendations on a statewide remote learning school
