



Spring 2023 Commission Member Priorities

This brief summarizes feedback received in the spring of 2023 from Commission members reflecting the educational technology (ed tech) priorities of those members' appointing agencies and organizations, as the Commission prepares to design its next state ed tech plan. Sections below highlight the overarching goals, proposed focus areas, and guiding considerations for each initiative the Commission designs.

Goals

- Equity of access to high-quality, personalized learning experiences
- Preparation for college, career, and life
- Flexibility in learning design and modalities

Focus Areas

- Data Privacy: Student and school data (cybersecurity)
- Digital Equity: Broadband, devices, and support
- Digital Literacy: Especially social media, social and emotional
- Online Learning: Uses of remote and hybrid learning
- Open Education: Free, high-quality courses and materials
- Sustainability: Post-pandemic support of devices and software
- Use of Artificial Intelligence: In instruction, software use (bias)

Guiding Considerations

- Why: Relevance to the Commission's vision and mission
- How: The steps we need to take to bring about impact
- Barriers: Obstacles including laws, policies, or resource deficits
- Resources: People, policies, funding, etc.
- Priority: The long-term importance of the initiative
- Urgency: Time-sensitivity, now and in the future
