WHO SHOULD ATTEND:

This three-hour training is open to building code enforcement officials. Select a time and location convenient for you.

TRAINING OVERVIEW:

This seminar will focus on the critical electrical concerns related to recreational bodies of water, and will detail the **2017 National Electrical Code** portion of the 2018 State Building Code with emphasis on Article 680 as pertains to recreational and therapeutic bodies of water. A brief review of Electrical Code pool specific definitions will transition to general requirements for electrical installations proximal to water containment. The specific electrical issues related to pools, spas, hot tubs, and hydro-massage tubs will be reviewed, and bonding requirements will be detailed for the various installations.

This seminar will provide participants with a checklist to ensure that vital inspection points are viewed. Please note that a PowerPoint presentation will **NOT** be available for this class. The downloadable checklist will serve as both a class guide and a field inspection guide. The **2017 National Electrical** **Code** portion of the 2018 State Building Code is a suggested resource for the class.
