STATE BUILDING CODE INTERPRETATION NO. I-6-03

The following is offered in response to your letter to me dated May 14, 2003 in which you seek an official interpretation of the provisions of Article 230-50 (a) of the 1999 National Electrical Code portion of the 1999 State Building Code.

Question: Who determines where service cables might be subject to physical damage, and therefore require protection?

Answer: That determination is to be made by the local building official, taking into account factors such as the likelihood of damage to the cable by motor vehicles and equipment. A reasonable approach must, however, be taken. For instance, the mounting of overhead service entry cables to the side of a building adjacent to a driveway does not represent being subject to physical damage, since damaging the cables would only be accomplished by running into the building with a vehicle. On the other hand, underground service entry cables emerging from the ground shall be protected by enclosures or raceways as prescribed by Article 300-5(d).
